ADOPT-A-PARK

The parks were reviewed:

Meadows – Terry said the Martinez family will continue with this park.

Trailside – Mrs. Lorraine Martinez can no longer care of this park.

Pond – Barbara will contact Iris Buckles to see if she wants to continue.

Kestrel – The Armstrong's are sure to be able to take care of this.

West Clinton – Justin said his church will continue with this park.

Heritage, Clinton Trail, Veteran's, Powerline, Civic Center, and Rail Trail need adopters.

Barbara will check with the Youth Council regarding the Civic Center. We can check with Clinton Elementary to see if they would take care of Veteran's.

Jason inquired about a dog park, but the Board said that the City doesn't want it because of the liability, mess, etc. He said that maybe they could put more trash receptacles around the disc golf baskets to help with trash. We really need neighborhood groups or organizations to help with the parks so that it's not all on one or two people.

DISC GOLF

Jason presented the final layout of the course. Baskets 1, 2, 6, and the practice basket are installed. The Board requested that Zac give an update on the progress and when the grand opening could be, as well as working with Jason on signage, etc. Jason presented a mini-Frisbee that Innova makes as a promo. He suggested having a competition test with a sample basket at our Heritage Days booth, and then the person can have one of the mini-Frisbees as a prize. A suggestion was made to maybe get coupons from Big 5 Sporting Goods to hand out for people to use to buy starter disc golf kits. Jason will also look into the cost of imprinting a city logo on the Frisbees for the city to possibly sell to promote the course.

MISCELLANEOUS & NEWSLETTER

a) Veteran's Park – Discussion was made regarding the re-installation of the bricks and if there should be a re-dedication ceremony. One date to shoot for is Armed Forces Day on May 18th. If done by July 4th, we can include pictures at our Heritage Days booth. Also, we could have the dedication on the Saturday of Heritage Days, between 2:00 & 4:00, when the community is in the area.

b) Terry asked why the clock in the Civic Center is not working.

c) Barbara said that the columbarium's have been included in this year's budget as instructed by the Mayor.

d) Kent discussed the ball diamonds at the Civic Center. He said that the grass is too high, the mounds and batting areas are in terrible shape. The adult fields are pretty good but the kid's fields are terrible. He said that Meadows fields are unplayable. The Recreation Department needs to look into this and coordinate with the Parks Department. The Board recommended that the City Council address this. Kent, Jason, and any interested baseball people should appear at the March 26th City Council meeting and present their views. The Board said that we could recommend that Mike Child appear at our next Parks Board meeting in April.
