### ADOPT-A-PARK

Follow-up to last month's meeting:

Justin said that the man listed for Heritage Park is no longer stationed at HAFB. Someone else is supposed to call Justin back, but he hasn't heard anything yet. Team Excelsior for the Rail Trail, Ben Towery has not returned Justin's phone calls.

Terry said that the Martinez's are still okay with Meadows Park. Mr. Cluff stated that no dogs or bikes are allowed on the track in Meadows because the path is too narrow. Terry said that he would rather have people with bikes on the walking trail than them being on the street.

The "No Dogs Allowed" sign has been removed from Powerline Park's east side sign.

Regarding Veteran's Park, Mr. Cluff said he would send an email to the City Council members asking for direction on the design and replacing the bricks so they can be done by July 4<sup>th</sup>.

Terry said that Zac had mentioned the idea of removing the garbage cans from the parks so that people, who brought items into the parks, had to take them out of the parks. Mr. Cluff said that probably wouldn't happen. Large garbage bins don't work and that smaller cans are better.

Rail Trail – Mr. Cluff said that the trail is being re-routed at 1000 W and 1300 N; there will be 5-6 parking spaces; no restroom, but a water faucet for people and a dog bowl will be installed.

There may be a restroom provided at 1000 W and 2300 N. The next phase is the parking lot.

This needs to be submitted for next month's newsletter.

Mr. Cluff said that they're looking at a restroom near the tunnel at 1000 W 800 N, next to the cemetery, if grant money can be obtained.

### PICKLE BALL

Mr. Cluff presented a proposed map for the pickle ball installation at Meadows Park. The bid for it was \$170,000, which is more than the anonymous donation we received. However, he's looking into a grant to pay half of the cost with the City picking up the other half. It would be a Federal grant, with the State Parks administering it. The City has budgeted our portion for next year and if the grant is received, it will be a "go". There will also be cables installed under the concrete to keep it from cracking.

The next Board meeting will be on **June 6, 2018 at 7:00 PM.**
