IMPORTANT INFORMATION.....

Fuel-Gas Fired Appliance Installations

Thinking of adding or upgrading a gas appliance in your home? A licensed mechanical contractor must obtain a building permit for all gas-fired appliance additions or upgrades. After the completion of the installation of the appliance, the mechanical contractor is responsible to ensure the pipe sizing and pressure testing of any new portion of the fuel-line system is in compliance with the current edition of the International Mechanical Code and International Fuel Gas Code. This certification is provided by the mechanical contractor through the completion of a "Clinton City Fuel Gas Clearance Report". Upon receipt of the completed form by the building inspector, the clearance is then forwarded to Questar Gas for the restoration of service.

Clinton City has implemented this policy in order to help ensure the safe and proper installation of all fuel-gas burning appliances. Only agencies/individuals pre-approved by Clinton City shall be recognized to certify the sizing and pressure testing of any residential or commercial mechanical fuel-line system located within the city limits. CLINTON LONG RANGE PLANS

The Wasatch Front Regional Council, WFRC, which accomplishes long range planning for Weber, Davis, Morgan, Tooele and Salt Lake Counties, is in the process of preparing the 2030 Regional Transportation Plan. This plan lists and prioritizes highway, street, rail and trail transportation projects for future funding and construction throughout the five county area.

The Clinton City Council has been actively campaigning to have several projects placed on this Plan. Recent successes can be seen in the work being done on the Denver & Rio Grand Trail and the 2000 West project. Other projects of interest to the Council include the 1800 North Overpass at the UP Tracks, Complete Development of 1800 North from Main to 4500 West, Widening of 2000 West from Antelope to Midland, Reconstruction of the 800 North Bridge, and Development of 800 North from 1000 W to 2000 W projects within the City and the 1800 North I-15 Interchange outside of the City. The City has also been supportive of plans for expansion of the commuter rail and bus systems within the area along with continued development of the D&RG Trail to the north and south.

Of these projects the City has been successful in having all but one placed in the Plan. The project that would improve the intersection of 800 North and 1000 West as well as widen 800 North from 1000 W to 2000 W has not been placed in the Plan. The public comment period for the Plan runs from April 7 through May 6. Your comments could help in having the 800 North project placed on the plan and in moving the other projects up the priority list. Public meetings are being planned along with requests for comments. The plan along with the schedule of events may be reviewed at the WFRC web site, www.wfrc.org/cms/index.php and will be published in local papers. Once you have reviewed the plan, comments may be made by e-mail to Val John Halford at vhalford@wfrc.org.

Public comment provided to the WFRC concerning the Regional Transportation Plan is an important part of developing the plan. This is an opportunity for you to provide your input related to long range planning issues that not only affect Clinton City directly but the entire Wasatch Front. COMMUNITY UPDATE

From the Community Development Department

The Clinton City Council has directed the city staff to go forward with an aggressive construction year with projects in many areas of the City. Along with the development of the amenities at the Civic Center the Council has taken action to start the following projects.

2007 STREET PROJECT:

The City has had a successful bid from Staker & Parson's Construction for the 2007 Street Projects. These neighborhood street projects will remove and reconstruct the asphaltic portion of the streets in the following areas.

1700 North from 2800 West to 2650 West
2175 North from 1300 West to 1100 West
1100 West from 2175 North to 2300 North
900 West from 2075 North to 2300 North
1950 North from 630 West to 550 West
550 West from 1800 North to 2050 North
2100 North and 2250 North cul-de-sacs off of 1200 West
2050 North east of 1200 West to the new subdivision
2600 North from 800 North to 1050 North will be overlaid

Also included in this year projects is, the collector street, 1000 West from 1300 North to 1800 North with a round-about being constructed at 1300 North and new curb being installed on the east side of 1000 West.

2850 WEST COMM. DEV. BLOCK GRANT (CDBG)

The City has had a successful bid from Staker & Parson's Construction for the 2850 West CDBG Project extending from 1550 North to 1800 North. This project will reconstruct the street with new curb, gutter, and sidewalk, install a larger water main and a storm drain system. The project is scheduled to start later this month. Residents in this construction area will be notified for a neighborhood meeting in the near future.

2000 WEST FROM 1300 NORTH TO 2300 NORTH

This is a major project that will take the entire construction season this year and part of next year. The asphaltic portion of the street is scheduled to be replaced and open by the end of September. Throughout construction two lanes are to be maintained by the contractor; however, as with any construction project of this size, anticipate periods of closure. Construction has started on this project by Rocky Mountain Power and earth moving will soon be seen in the vicinity of 1300 North to replace existing flood irrigation pipes before the season starts.

2007 STORM DRAIN PROJECT

These projects are rapidly coming to completion. A pipe has been installed in 800 North from 1750 West to 2000 West, in 2300 North from 3250 West to 3500 West and work is being done on the Clinton Creek crossing at 2050 North 3000 West. The first two of these projects are complete except for clean-up and the 2050 North 3000 West site will soon be complete.

Remember, one of the great things about living in Utah is the four season climate; however, one of the bad things is the limited construction period created by the four seasons. When a sign at a construction site indicates that a street is closed except to local traffic, local traffic means those that live in the construction area not everyone in the city. When a sign says the street is closed don't go down the street. Please be courteous in construction zones, drive safely and remember that tickets are issued for driving on closed streets and fines are doubled for speeding in a construction zone even though there may not be a sign indicating so.

Drive safely as you find your way around these construction areas, through less familiar neighborhoods, remember to drive slow, watch for children at play and construction workers concentrating on their job, not your car.
