A Message from Public Works

Snow packed streets can be inconvenient. So why do some of the residential streets have a snow pack remaining and others are bare pavement? Timing! Generally temperatures are warmer during the storm and then drop after the storm has passed. A typical storm passes through leaving up to 6" of snow and then clears out so it is only necessary for crews to make one pass through the city with plows, followed by the salt trucks which melt the thin layer left by the plows before the temperatures drop. During an extended storm everything changes! Many of the streets that are plowed first will be covered with several inches of new snow as the storm continues before the crews are able to finish plowing the rest of the city. So when they return to the streets that were plowed first, new snow has been packed on the streets by traffic and the temperatures have dropped making it impossible for the plows to remove the remaining snow. Salt has an effective temperature range in which it will melt the ice off of the streets but if it is applied after the temperatures have already dropped it will not work. Plow trucks can not cut ice from the pavement. If your street is snow packed and really rough please call and we will do what we can to push snow and ice off as it loosens up.

The streets will normally be plowed to provide better access to the higher traveled streets first. This priority puts main (collector) roads first, with special attention to hills and difficult intersections. Subsequently the subdivision streets are plowed with smaller trucks used in cul-de-sacs and dead ends.

Winter driving can be unpredictable. Please pay attention to road conditions, be patient and drive safely.

RED CROSS WINTER SAFETY TIPS

1. Wear layers of lightweight clothing, a hat & gloves to stay warm.
2. Bring pets indoors or provide them enough shelter to keep warm & give them access to unfrozen water.
3. Protect your pipes - run a trickle of water to help prevent your pipes from freezing. Open the kitchen and bathroom cabinet doors to allow warmer air to circulate around the plumbing. Be sure to move any harmful cleaners and household chemicals out of the reach of children. Keep the garage doors closed.
4. Keep the thermostat at the same temp to avoid freezing pipes.
5. If you are using a space heater, place it on a level, hard surface at least 3 ft from paper, clothing, bedding, curtains or rugs. Turn off space heaters and make sure fireplace embers are out before bed.
7. Never use a stove or oven to heat your home.
8. Use a glass or metal fireplace screen to catch sparks and logs.
9. Never operate a generator inside the home, including in the basement or garage.
10. Don't hook a generator up to the home's wiring. The safest thing to do is to connect the equipment you want to power directly to the outlets on the generator.

The City Council recently adopted **Ordinance 15-10Z**, amending Title 28 Ch 3 of the Clinton City Zoning Code.

28-3-9(3) (f) & (g) now allows for rabbits to be kept as pets in doors.

28-14.2(7) now allows for residential chickens to be kept in all residential zones on parcels of 10,000 sq. ft. or larger. Residential chickens are required to be registered with the City. Contact Community Development at 801-614-0740.
