



Notice of Sewer Increases

The City sewer costs are divided up into 2 separate areas: 1) the City cost of maintaining the system which collects the sewage and delivers it to the North Davis Sewer District's (NSDS) system; and, 2) the payment to the (NSDS) for treating our sewage according to state and federal standards. In order to accommodate the need for improvements in the NDS transport and treatment facilities, in 2014, they began a four year process of increasing their fees by \$3 per customer per month each year through 2017. As a result, there will be a \$3 increase again this year and another in 2017. These fee increases are strictly pass through fees to the NDS. This increase will be reflected in the August bill. Thank you.

Yikes! Don't flush it down the toilet!

Please consider what you put down your sinks and toilets. Paper towels, baby wipes, cleaning wipes, cooking grease, diapers, sanitary napkins, dental floss and any other paper, plastic or cloth materials contribute to sewer blockages and pump failures in the sewer collection system.

City crews work hard to maintain our system; however they struggle to keep pipes clear of disposable wipes and scrubbers like those advertised on TV. Contrary to the advertisements, these wipes and scrubbers are not sewer system friendly, and they significantly increase the likelihood of a sanitary sewer backup in your basement as well as your neighbors' basements. As sewer backups caused by these wipes can occur rapidly, the city will not be responsible for the backup and any related damages. Please do not dispose of paper or plastic products (beyond toilet tissue) in your toilet or other drains. The home you save may be your own.
