SAFE EXCHANGE ZONE NOW AVAILABLE IN CLINTON

Clinton City residents don't have to worry about a safe place to make that Craigslist or KSL Sale switch. The Police Department has created a safe exchange zone by designating 3 parking stalls directly north of the Police building at 2209 N 1500 W as a safe exchange zone. The safe zone is under 24 hour surveillance, in a well-lit, visible location and is clearly identified with signs.

We hope this can be used as a safe place for residents to meet and complete a transaction, or to do parental custody exchanges.



A MESSAGE FROM OUR WATER DEPARTMENT

The Clinton City Water Department is in the process of upgrading the water system by installing Dual Check devices at residential locations that currently don't have them. Since last August, crews have installed 350 new Dual Checks & serviced 420 existing ones. This process is making the Drinking Water safer by preventing future cross-connections.
