Air Tests Offered To Clinton Residents

Hill AFB plans to test the air in Clinton homes this fall and winter as part of its continuing indoor air sampling program. In September, information packets will be mailed to approximately 356 residents who live above the area of groundwater contamination located in the northeastern portion of Clinton. These packets will include more detailed information about the air testing program and a postcard that residents are to return if they wish to have their home tested. While not in the drinking water, chemical vapors from the groundwater contamination could enter homes through the basement or floor slab. Over the past few years, Hill has tested the air in more than 1,600 homes, including 196 in Clinton. Approximately 24 percent of the homes tested have been found to have very low levels of chemical vapors. At the levels typically found, the vapors do not pose a health risk to residents, but to ensure residents' safety, the Air Force will work with residents to monitor and, in some instances, install a system in the home to remove the vapors. There is no cost to the resident for any of the actions taken as part of the air testing program.
