2009 Municipal Election Information

For 2009, there are three Council seats up for election, the Mayor and two City Council seats.

The Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, September 15th at City Hall in the Court Chambers on the lower level, 2267 N 1500 W and the new Recreation Building, 1651 W 2300 N. Early voting will be available at City Hall only, from 1 to 5 PM Tuesday through Friday two weeks prior to the Election beginning September 1 and ending September 10.

The General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 3rd in the same locations. Early voting will take place at City Hall from 1 to 5 PM two weeks prior beginning October 21 and ending October 3.

The Clinton City Youth Council will host this year's "**Meet The Candidates Night**" on **August 26th at 6 PM at the Clinton Recreation Building 1651 W 2300 N**. Please come out to meet the candidates and support your community.

New Voter ID Requirement

Effective 2009 – All voters will be required to present *identification* before being allowed to vote. (Utah Code 20A-3-104).

Valid voter identification consists of one of the following three options:

A form of identification that bears the name and photograph of the voter which may include:


- a currently valid Utah driver's license ;
- a currently valid identification card that is issued by:
 - the state
 - a branch, department, or agency of the United States
- a currently valid Utah permit to carry a concealed weapon ;
- a currently valid United States passport; or
- a valid tribal identification card, whether or not the card includes a photograph of the voter

A form of identification listed above that does not contain a photograph, but establishes the name of the voter and provides evidence that the voter resides in the voting precinct, if at least one other form of identification listed below is also presented

Two documents that show the name of the voter and provide evidence that the voter resides in the voting precinct, which may include:

- a current utility bill or a legible copy thereof, dated within the 90 days before the election ;
- a bank or other financial account statement, or a legible copy thereof;
- a certified birth certificate;
- a valid Social Security card;
- a check issued by the state or the federal government, or a legible copy thereof;
- a paycheck from the voter's employer, or a legible copy thereof;
- a currently valid Utah hunting or fishing license;
- certified naturalization documentation;
- a currently valid license issued by an authorized agency of the United States government;
- a certified copy of court records showing the voter's adoption or name change;
- a valid Medicaid card, Medicare card, or Electronic Benefits Transfer card;
- a currently valid identification card issued by:
 - a local government within the state
 - an employer for an employee; or
 - a college, university, technical school, or professional school

A current Utah vehicle registration.

### HUNTER SAFETY CLASSES

#### AUGUST, SEPTEMBER, NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER

Clinton Recreation will begin teaching Hunter Education Classes in August in the new Recreation Administration Building at 1651 W 2300 N. from 6:00 pm to 8:30 pm. Attendance at all classes is mandatory. In order to sign up participants must pre-register at the Clinton Recreation Offices and pay \$5. You must also pay \$10 for a hunter Safety voucher that is available at any location where hunting and fishing licenses are sold. This course includes instruction on hunter responsibility, firearms, ammunition safety, shooting fundamentals, principal's of wildlife, first aid, water safety and more. ### Hill AFB Air Sampling - Air Tests Offered To Clinton Residents

Hill AFB plans to test the air in Clinton homes this fall and winter as part of its continuing indoor air sampling program. In September, information packets will be mailed to approximately 380 residents who live above the area of groundwater contamination located in the northeastern portion of Clinton. These packets include more detailed information about the air testing program and a postcard that residents are to return if they wish to have their homes tested.

While not in the drinking water, chemicals from the groundwater can easily evaporate and enter homes from the ground. Over the past few years, Hill has tested the air in more than 1,700 homes, including 211 in Clinton. Approximately 24 percent of the homes tested in Clinton have been found to have very low levels of chemical vapors. At the levels typically found, the vapors do not pose a health risk to residents, but to ensure residents' safety, the Air Force will work with residents to monitor and, in some instances, install a system in the home to remove the vapors. There is no cost to the resident for any of the actions taken as part of the air testing program.

### POLICE QUOTAS - True or False?

It has been rumored that the Clinton City Police Department has a ticket quota for each officer to meet within a required period of time. ***This is false.***

Officers are required to meet certain performance standards and are evaluated quarterly and annually on these standards. ***This is true.***

This department has never had a quota and one is not planned for in the future. The reason an officer issues a traffic ticket is because he sees someone committing a violation that should not be overlooked. Historically, citations are issued due to violations of state, county, city laws or safety issues. When an officer issues a citation, it shows he is being observant and stops those who are breaking the law. Safety is the issue and is the reason we have traffic laws.

The Clinton City Police Department provides the community with trained and qualified law enforcement officers who have a keen eye for criminal or traffic offenses that take place within their scope of responsibilities. Officers are required to respond to any and all calls for service from citizens as well as from other neighboring jurisdictions requesting assistance from our officers. Officers are required to be impartial and unbiased in their day to day contact with the public, especially when it comes to writing tickets.

We are here to serve the needs of the community, including you. It doesn't matter who you are. We are here to protect you, your property, and your community from those who would break the laws. It's not always the other person who commits the violation, sometimes it's you...sometimes it's unknowingly, sometimes you're in a hurry and sometimes it may be because you think you might not get caught. But if you do, it's not because "the officer doesn't have anything better to do." ***That is true!***
