IS THERE SNOW ON YOUR ROOF?

Snow may have accumulated on top of the roof of your home; during the winter, our area will sometimes accumulate a substantial amount of snow on our roofs. Many times we have seen concerned homeowners on top of their roofs trying to shovel (in some cases snow blow) the snow off in fear that it will make their roofs collapse.

The roof systems in our area are designed to support the snow loads and Clinton City recommends that property owners **do not** attempt to remove the snow from their roofs. Besides the personal risk taken by the property owner to remove the snow, major damage/leaks can be caused to the shingles themselves from the shoveling. If you are concerned that the snow has reached a depth that may damage the structure of your home, contact a professional who is trained/insured to do the job properly and safely.

Jazz Player Appearance

Youth Soccer Sign-Ups

Registrations for the youth soccer program will be February 2nd through February 20th. The soccer program is for children Pre-school age (year before they enter kindergarten) through 6th grade. The fee is \$40 and includes; jersey, shorts, socks, practices and games. Practices are tentatively set to begin the week of March 9th and games the week of March 23rd. Job applications are currently being taken through the Recreation Department for spring and summer positions. Immediate openings are available for soccer referees. Applicants should have general knowledge of and experience with the sport of soccer. Applications may be picked up Monday thru Friday 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at the Recreation Department.

Reserving a Park Bowery or Rental Room

We will begin taking registrations for 2009 rentals on January 2nd at 8:00 am.

Clinton City currently has boweries at 5 parks that may be reserved for various activities throughout the year. Veterans Park (1000 W 1800 N), Meadows Park (575 W 2300 N), West Clinton Park (2750 W 1800 N), Heritage Park (1000 W 1300 N) and Civic Center City Park (1500 W 2300 N). Reservations for these facilities are taken at the Recreation Department beginning the first working day of the calendar year for that year. You must reserve facilities in person, fill out a contract and provide a payment. Bowery's can be reserved from April 15th through October 15th.

Park Bowery Fees are: \$30 for a 5 hour block of time.

Community Rental Room

Our new Community Rental Room is ready for public use. Reservations for all rentals are taken at the Clinton Recreation Administration Building at 1651 W 2300 N. Reservations are on a first come, first served basis and must be made in person. Rental fee is paid at the time of reservation and deposit is paid on the last working day prior to the rental when the key is picked up. The new rental room is 25' X 38' and has a kitchen attached to it as well as an outdoor patio area. The rental rate is \$40 per hour plus a \$250 refundable deposit. The rental fee includes tables and chairs for up to 75 people. In addition the Recreation Department has a training room connected to the rental area. On weekends (Friday Night, Saturday and Sunday) when the training room is not in use, it can also be used for rentals. The Community Room with the Training Room measures 25' X 66'. The rental rate for both rooms is \$60 per hour plus a \$250 refundable deposit. Rental fee includes chairs and tables for up to 130 people. Rental rooms will NOT be available Christmas Day, New Years Eve or New Years Day.

Hunter Safety Classes

The Clinton City Recreation Department is once again sponsoring Hunter Safety Classes. The next class with openings will be held in February. Dates for the Class will be February 2, 3, 4, 9, 10, 11 with the range day on February 7th. Classes will meet from 6:00 pm to 8:30 pm and attendance at ALL classes is required. To sign up for the February Hunter Safety Class you must call the recreation department at 614-0780 to make sure we still have openings, then go to any location where Hunting and Fishing licenses are sold and pay \$10 for a voucher. You then bring that voucher to the Clinton Recreation Administration Building and pay \$5 for the class. You must Pre-Register for the class. Registration will NOT be accepted the night of the first class. On the first night of class please bring your voucher and Recreation Department receipt.
