Title 16 Motor Vehicles and Traffic of the Clinton City Code has been revised. To read the City Code on our website go to www.clintoncity.net, and click on the [Research City Ordinances](#) link on the homepage.

The Police Department would like to *emphasize* the following sections for the public to be aware of: 16-7-16 Using Streets for Storage, and 16-7-21 Restricted Recreational Vehicles.

16-7-16 Using Streets For Storage.

(1) Restrictions: No person who owns or has possession, custody or control of any non-motorized vehicle, utility trailer, house trailer, boat, boat trailer or any other type of trailer shall park or store the vehicle, trailer or boat, whether attached or unattached to a motor vehicle, upon any public street for a period of time more than twenty four (24) hours. Non-motorized vehicles shall be considered to be in violation of this section if parked in any one location for longer than twenty four (24) hours or if the vehicle has been parked in one or more locations within the same block for longer than a twenty four (24) hour period.

16-7-21 Restricted Recreational Vehicles.

(1) Definitions: (a) Recreational Vehicle: A vehicular unit, primarily designed as a temporary dwelling for travel, recreational, and vacation use, which is either self-propelled or is mounted on or pulled by another vehicle, including but not limited to, a travel trailer, a camping trailer, a truck camper, a motor home, a fifth wheel trailer and a van.

(b) Restricted Recreational Vehicle: A recreational vehicle which has or exceeds either a body height of seven feet (7'), a body width of eight feet (8') or a body length of twenty feet (20').

(c) Residential Areas: It shall be unlawful to park, place, store, or otherwise leave a restricted recreational vehicle upon any street in a residential area for a period of time longer than twenty four (24) hours. Vehicles shall be considered to be in violation of this Section if parked in any one location for longer than twenty four (24) hours or if the vehicle has been parked in one or more locations within the same block for a twenty four (24) hour period.

(d) Intersections: It shall be unlawful to stop, stand or park a restricted recreational vehicle within forty feet (40') of an intersection.

These laws are now in effect and the Police Department will enforce them beginning immediately. If you have questions or concerns regarding this law, please contact Police Chief Bill Chilson at 801-614-0800.

CITIZENS ON PATROL VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Citizens on Patrol (C.O.P.) is one of the ways the police department utilizes residents to help fight crime in our neighborhoods. The volunteers for C.O.P. help patrol neighborhoods and watch for suspicious activities. The volunteers are trained by the police department to report possible criminal activity or other concerns to the on duty officers or through the dispatch center. Municipal Elections

Up coming election information can be found on the Clinton City web site at www.clintoncity.net. Three Council seats are up for election, the Mayor and two City Council seats, all 4-year terms. Persons wishing to be a candidate must:

- Be a registered voter;
- Have resided within Clinton City for the 12 consecutive months immediately preceding the November election date; and,
- Not have been convicted of treason or a felony and lost the right to vote.

A city resident may become a candidate for the Mayor or City Council seat by either:

- Declaring Candidacy with the City Manager (signing the form) and paying a \$25.00 fee; or, Obtaining a Nomination Petition from the City Manager's office and getting 25 or more qualified signatures (Clinton residents 18 yrs of age or older)- No Fee.

Petitions or declarations for candidacy can only be filed with the City Manager from **July 1st to July 15th**, as set by State Code. All petitions or declarations must be correctly completed and returned to the City before 5:00 P.M. on July 15, 2009.

State law now requires each voter to show proper ID before they can vote.

Kids in the Park

Kids in the Park for children ages 5-12 years old – Mon - Thur 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon now thru August 13th; children may sign up to participate on a monthly basis.

Contact Football – DEADLINE IS JULY 10TH

Youth ages 7 to 15 (with some restrictions) can sign up to play WFEL football through Clinton Recreation. Registration runs thru July 10th at the Recreation office. Cost for the program is \$95. To register, you must bring your 1) Birth Certificate, 2) Proof of Medical Insurance (medical card), 3) Proof of residency (i.e., water bill); 4) \$95 Registration fee. Also...each participant must have a physical within the last 6 months or have a physical prior to July 28th. All Clinton and Sunset residents MUST sign up in Clinton; this is a league By-Law. Youth Soccer

Registration for youth fall soccer will begin July 1st thru July 23rd. This soccer program is for children Pre-School age (year before they enter Kindergarten) through 6th grade. The fee is \$40 for residents and includes a jersey, shorts, socks games and practices.

LANDLORD'S AND RENTER'S BEWARE

The Community Development Department has been receiving complaints regarding the condition of home rentals throughout the city. Although this is typically considered a civil matter between the tenant/renter and the landlord, the staff looked into some of the complaints to identify why the city was receiving them.

The items of concern fall into two (2) categories which are addressed in the International Building Codes and the City Zoning Ordinance. Staff noted the following concerns and would like to pass them on to those who are currently renting or considering renting a home in Clinton City.

Building Issues:

1. Many of the code violations have been found to be in single family dwellings which have been separated into individual units on the main and basement levels. This is not permitted unless the structure was originally designed and intended to be a multi-unit structure.
2. The homes inspected do not provide the individual tenants with separate HVAC, water heater and electrical service which is required by code for multi-family units.
3. The work done in the homes inspected was completed without permits or inspection. The work was also done by unqualified, unlicensed individual's who have exposed the tenant's to numerous safety concerns addressed by every model code.

Zoning Issues:

1. 98 % of the dwelling units within Clinton City fall within zones or areas that only allow single family dwellings. The other 2% of the dwelling units in Clinton City are multi-family units of four or more.

Conclusion:

Single family homes are zoned, designed and built to be just that, a single family home. If you currently own or rent one of these separated units, be aware that when identified, the city will be forced to take the legal steps necessary to return the home to it's originally intended use. All costs/fines will be the responsibility of the property owner.

Clinton City Fire Officials would like to remind our citizens of a few safety tips when using fireworks this July

- Fireworks may be discharged 3 days before and /or 3 days after; July 4th, July 24th, and January 1st or the Chinese New Year.
- Always have adult supervision when lighting fireworks and use common sense. Please follow the directions.
- Do not discharge fireworks closer than 20 feet from your residence.
- Make sure your fireworks are legal in Utah. It is a Class "C" misdemeanor for a person to sell, discharge or to have illegal fireworks in their possession.


