Attention: Clinton City is excited to partner with Express Bill Pay, the premier local government online payment provider. Effective June 6, 2011, if you have previously used our online service, you will be required to re-register to create a new account with this new provider.

All you need is an Internet connection through a Web browser and an e-mail address. It's simple to use. Every month we'll send you a reminder e-mail to let you know when your bill is online. Then you just log in to your account at www.clintoncity.net or XpressBillPay.com and view your bill. It's formatted like your paper statement so it will look familiar to you. You can also view prior billed history on your account.

When you're ready to pay your bill, select a payment type. You can pay with credit card, debit card, or electronic funds transfer. Then enter the information and you're done! It only takes you a few minutes each month, or if you prefer you can set up a recurring scheduled payment. It's that easy!

2011 Municipal Elections

Three 4-year City Council seats are up for the election process this year. The seats currently belong to Council Persons Anna Stanton, David Pearson and Cheri Reed. Candidate Declaration forms and petitions must be completed and returned to the City Manager's office between July 1st and July 15th by 5:00 P.M. All persons wishing to run for one of these council seats must: 1) sign and declare candidacy with the City Manager's office; and, 2) either pay a \$25 candidacy fee or obtain 25 or more qualified signatures on an official Nomination Petition (no fee), available from the City Manager's office. CLINTON CITY NATIVE WINS UTAH TREE CLIMBING CHAMPIONSHIP

John Dallinga won the Utah Community Forest Council's 17th Annual Tree Climbing Championship held at Robinson Park in American Fork on May 21, 2011. The event included 32 Masters level professional climbers from across the state. The competition involved five climbs including the Work Climb, Aerial Rescue, Belayed Speed Climb, Secured Foot Lock, and Throw Line. Each climb tests a competitor's ability to quickly, professionally, and safely maneuver in a tree while performing work-related tree-care tasks. John garnered the highest score and the event championship.

John was raised in Clinton and attended Clinton area schools. Being crowned Utah champion, he has earned the right to represent Utah, and the United States at the 35th annual International Tree Climbing Competition (ITCC) to be held in Sydney, Australia on July 23 and 24, 2011. This event is considered the world championship of tree climbing. Congratulations and good luck John!

Kids in the Park

Kids in the Park for children ages 5-12 years old – Mon - Thur 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon now thru July 28th; children may sign up to participate on a monthly basis.

Tennis Lessons 2nd Session

Tennis lessons will be offered for boys and girls ages 7 - 16 beginners to intermediate/advanced July 5th thru July 14th. The lessons will be held at the Clinton City Park tennis courts and the cost is \$30 for residents.

Tumbling & Dance Lessons

Contact Football – DEADLINE IS JULY 8TH

Youth ages 7 to 15 (with some restrictions) can sign up to play WFFL football through Clinton Recreation. Registration runs thru July 8th at the Recreation office. Cost for the program is \$110. To register, you must bring your 1) Birth Certificate, 2) Proof of Medical Insurance (medical card), 3) Proof of residency (i.e., water bill); 4) \$110 Registration fee. Also...each participant must have a physical within the last 6 months or have a physical prior to July 28th. All Clinton and Sunset residents MUST sign up in Clinton; this is a league By-Law. Youth Soccer

Registration for youth fall soccer will begin July 1st thru July 29th. This soccer program is for children Pre-School age (year before they enter Kindergarten) through 6th grade. The fee is \$45 for residents and includes a jersey, shorts, socks games and practices.

Sixth Annual Fishing Derby

The Clinton City Recreation Department will again host a fishing derby to kick off Heritage Days week. Clinton City Fire Department News

It's that time again for summer fun, Independence Day, and FIREWORKS. There have been some significant changes to Utah fireworks laws that go into effect for 2011. A new type of aerial fireworks is now lawful. Aerial devices, also known as "multiple tube," "repeater," or "cake" fireworks often look like miniature professional displays and can travel as much as 150 feet into the air.

Still not allowed are: firecrackers, M-80, cherry bombs, bottle rockets, Roman candles, single or reloadable mortars, and ground salutes. Please remember that you must be **at least 16** years of age to handle or light fireworks. Fireworks need space from trees, carports, structures, or other obstacles. Aerial or "cake" fireworks need at least a 30 foot bubble of clearance around on the ground and above in the air. Some may need 150 feet of clearance in the air. Should fireworks misfire or not light, do not attempt to re-ignite them.

Children are burned each year by sparklers. The tip of a sparkler burns at a temperature of more than 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit, hot enough to cause 3rd degree burns. Never hold or light more than one sparkler at a time. Teach children to hold a sparkler at arm's length away from their body and not to wave sparklers or run while holding sparklers.

Please be polite to your neighbors while celebrating with fireworks and observe Clinton City noise ordinance (Title 17). **Please have fireworks out by 10pm.** Also note that you may discharge fireworks 3 days before and 3 days after Independence Day. Remember to have fun and help us all to keep the community safe.

Water Surface Drainage

When determining landscape designs or modifications to your yard, being able to properly control & divert water drainage from your home should be a primary consideration. Here are some facts to consider in order to achieve proper drainage on your property.

WATER SURFACE DRAINAGE:


Contributing factors to the problem of water drainage around structures within the city are:

- 1- Improper diversion of run-off water from rain gutter downspouts.
- 2- Lack of required slope (6" for first 10' away from foundation)
- 3- Over watering of lawns by both manual and automatic sprinkler systems
- 4- Improperly maintaining or stabilizing means of landscape/retention.

Because of the amounts of moisture already present in the soil surrounding structures within the city, property owners are advised to inspect their property to ensure proper drainage has been provided to eliminate the potential hazards mentioned above. Caution must be taken when establishing new or modifying existing diversion paths in order to avoid causing any impact to adjacent properties. Clinton City requests that you coordinate with your neighbors to establish these diversion paths prior to the installation of any fence or permanent obstruction. Water from downspouts should be properly diverted to storm drains or connected to landscape drainage boxes which can be purchased at most plumbing supply stores. Property owners should contact a licensed geotechnical engineer if your lot is showing signs of slippage or if your home or business is showing any signs of structural problems you feel may be a result of settlement.

Utah Mini Roundabout Etiquette



First rule is use your turn signal and cancel it prior to entering the roundabout unless you are taking the first exit.

Second rule is to yield to all pedestrians.

Third rule, yield to traffic (cars, bikes, etc.) in the roundabout.

Fourth rule is to signal to the right (2 Sec.) prior to leaving the roundabout.

Fifth rule is to respect the posted recommended speed restriction.

Now for the suggested etiquette part:

If you are in position "A" and you are going to position "B" you should have your right turn signal on before entering. If you are in position "A" and you are going to position "D" you should **not** use your turn signal to the right until you are at position "C" so as to not confuse the driver in position "S". If you are in position "A" and you are going to position "F" it would be polite to have your left turn signal on at position "A" until you reach position "E" at which time you shall switch your turn signal to the right just prior to leaving the roundabout. This technique will also help the driver in position "T" make an informed decision to yield to you.

If you are making a u-turn or missed your exit, leave your left turn signal on and follow rule # 4 above.

Please be tolerant and professional with people who haven't quite grasped roundabouts yet. They do save time, fuel, they are good for the environment and reduce collisions.
