## NOTICE OF CLINTON CITY PLANNING COMMISSION & BOARD OF ZONING ADJUSTMENT VACANCIES:

Clinton City currently has two (2) positions available on the Clinton City Planning Commission and (2) positions on the Clinton City Board of Zoning Adjustments. These positions are appointed by the Mayor and approved by the City Council.

**The Planning Commission** - meets the first & third Tuesday of each month. These positions are three (3) year terms. This body reviews Commercial Site plans, Subdivision Plats, Conditional Use Permits, and make recommendations to the City Council on Zoning Ordinance changes.

**Board of Zoning Adjustments** - meets whenever needed, usually on a Tuesday night. These positions are appointed for a five (5) year term. This is a Quasi-judicial body, which reviews requests for variances from the Zoning Ordinance.

#### Kids in the Park

Kids in the Park for children ages 5-11 years old – Mon - Thur 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon now thru Aug. 2<sup>nd</sup> may sign up to participate on a monthly basis.

#### Tennis Lessons 2<sup>nd</sup> Session

Tennis lessons will be offered for boys and girls ages 7 - 16 beginners to intermediate/advanced July 9<sup>th</sup> thru July 20<sup>th</sup>. The lessons will be held at the Clinton City Park tennis courts and the cost is \$30 for residents.

#### Tumbling & Dance Lessons

Head Over Heels Tumbling & Dance (1094 W 1800 N.) is offering tumbling & dance classes for ages 18 months to 16 years. Classes run July 9<sup>th</sup> - July 20<sup>th</sup> the cost is \$40 for residents.

#### Contact Football – DEADLINE IS JULY 6TH

Youth ages 7 to 15 (with some restrictions) can sign up to play WFFL football through Clinton Recreation. Registration runs thru July 6<sup>th</sup> at the Recreation office. Cost for the program is \$110. To register, you must bring your 1) Birth Certificate, 2) Proof of Medical Insurance (medical card), 3) Proof of residency (i.e., water bill); 4) \$110 Registration fee. Also...each participant must have a physical within the last 6 months or have a physical prior to July 16<sup>th</sup>. All Clinton and Sunset residents MUST sign up in Clinton; this is a league By-Law. If you have any question please contact the Recreation Department at 801-614-0780.

#### Youth Soccer

Registration for youth fall soccer will begin July 2<sup>nd</sup> thru July 27<sup>th</sup>. This soccer program is for children Pre-School age (year before they enter Kindergarten) through 6th grade. The fee is \$45 for residents and includes a jersey, shorts, socks games and practices.

#### Seventh Annual Fishing Derby

The Clinton City Recreation Department will again host a fishing derby to kick off Heritage Days week. The derby will be held on Tues, July 10<sup>th</sup> from 6:00 to 8:00 pm at the Clinton City Pond (3000 West 2500 North). Pre-registration will cost \$7 and is open to youth ages 0 to 16. On site registration is \$12 per person. As a reminder, children 12 years of age and older need a valid fishing license, if they plan to fish. #### West Davis Corridor Update

We are continuing to study both Alternatives A and B as part of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (Draft EIS). Currently, we are drafting chapters of the Draft EIS document and conducting a detailed analysis on impacts such as noise, water quality, and air quality. The result of this in-depth analysis will be reflected in the Draft EIS and available for public comment and at public hearings this fall 2012. A final decision is not expected until 2013.

Fireworks are an exciting and fun way to celebrate; however they need to be treated with respect and care.

Here are a few safety tips to keep your family and friends safe when using fireworks.

- Only use fireworks outdoors.
- Always have water handy (a hose or buckets of water).
- Only use fireworks as intended. DO NOT try to alter them or combine them.
- Never re-light a "dud" firework (wait 20 minutes and then soak it in a bucket of water).
- Use common sense when using fireworks. Spectators should keep a safe distance from the fireworks. The person lighting the fireworks should wear safety glasses.
- Alcohol and fireworks do not mix! Have a "designated" person light fireworks.
- Only persons over age 12 should be allowed to handle sparklers of any type.
- DO NOT use homemade fireworks or illegal explosives; they can kill! Report illegal explosives to the fire or police department.

There have been some new changes to the Utah State fireworks law that go into effect for 2012. As you may be aware there were significant changes that went into effect in 2011 allowing a new type of aerial firework, also known as "multiple tube", "repeater" or "cake" fireworks to be discharged in Utah. Last year the biggest concerns among citizens who filed complaints with the Utah State Fire Marshal's office and throughout the State were not the discharge of the aerial fireworks, but the noise and the length of days the fireworks could be discharged. The 2012 Utah state firework laws have been changed to mitigate those concerns. The firework discharge dates have been changed to 3 days before and 3 days after the 4<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> of July between the hours of 11 a.m. and 11 p.m. except on July 4<sup>th</sup> and July 24<sup>th</sup> then it is between the hours of 11 a.m. & Midnight. You can also discharge fireworks on New Year's Eve and the Chinese New Year between 11 a.m. and 1 a.m.

We are currently having a very hot dry summer, be aware of your surroundings and please use common sense when using fireworks.
