**TRADITIONAL AND INTERNET  
HUNTER SAFETY CLASSES**

Clinton Recreation will be teaching Hunter Education Classes this fall in the Recreation Administration Building at 1651 W 2300 N. Classes are from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. Attendance at all classes is mandatory. In order to sign up, you must purchase a Hunter Education voucher for \$10 available wherever hunting and fishing licenses are sold. Then participants must pre-register at the Clinton Recreation Offices and pay a \$5 fee. This course includes instruction on hunter responsibility, firearms, ammunition safety, shooting fundamentals, principal's of wildlife, first aid, water safety and more. Those that are taking the internet class must complete all tests prior to the class night. You must bring all completed tests or a certificate of completion and the voucher to the class. Future class dates are:

- Nov. 13<sup>th</sup>, Internet Class Range day Nov. 17<sup>th</sup>
- Dec. 4<sup>th</sup>, Internet Class Range Day Dec. 8<sup>th</sup>

**WEST DAVIS COORIDOR UPDATE**

We are continuing to study both Alternatives A and B as part of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (Draft EIS). Currently, we are drafting chapters of the Draft EIS document and conducting a detailed analysis on impacts such as noise, water quality, and air quality. The result of this in-depth analysis will be reflected in the Draft EIS. A final decision is not expected until 2013. **ROUNDABOUTS**

Clinton now has 3 roundabouts; one located at 2300 N & 1500 W, another at 2300 N & Cranefield Rd. (3650 W) and the last at 1300 N & 1000 W. More and more roundabouts are being installed not only in Clinton, but throughout the larger community to provide traffic flow and safety. As drivers, we need to become “roundabout smart”! Since roundabouts are actually **ONE-WAY** streets, there are only a few easy things to remember:

- **SLOW DOWN** - most roundabouts have a **15 mph** (or less) speed limit. This gives everyone more time to see and react to vehicular and pedestrian traffic.
- **LOOK LEFT!** - you only have to worry about traffic coming from the LEFT. As you approach the roundabout, slow down, look left, pause if you need to, and then merge into the roundabout.
- **BE COURTEOUS** - as in all driving situations, use good common sense and courtesy. Everyone knows you enter the roundabout by turning “right”, but the other drivers do not know where you plan to exit unless you signal ahead of your turn.

Use of these 3 roundabout driving suggestions will help you have a positive roundabout driving experience.

***Winter is coming... Please remember***

- **City Code 16-7-19** states that Winter Parking is in effect Nov 15th to Mar 15th. **NO OVERNIGHT PARKING** is allowed from midnight to 7:00 a.m. Contact the Police Dept at 801-614-0800 with questions.
- **City Code 18-1-3 (17) & (18)** states that ALL Clinton City property owners are responsible for keeping sidewalks along their property or business clear of snow and ice and prohibits anyone from depositing snow into public roads. Snow removed from sidewalks and driveways should be placed in the park strip area or on private property and NOT in the public roads. Snow removal of the driveway approaches is the resident's responsibility as well.
- **City Code 25-16-4(2)** states no basketball standards, recreation structures or other similar items that may entice children or others to play or gather within the right-of-way or cause balls or other items to be thrown into the right-of-way shall be constructed or placed within or adjacent to the right-of-way.


