**A Message from the Fire Department**

The Public Protection Classification (PPC™) ratings for communities are done on a scale from Class 1 to 10. Class 1 is the best rating you can receive; only 60 cities nationwide have this classification. Class 10 indicates that the area's fire-suppression program does not meet ISO's minimum criteria. A third of all fire districts/departments are rated Class 9 or Class 10. ISO statistics show that those communities have losses at least twice as high as their better-protected neighbors.

Clinton City's PPC program rating was increased from a Class 5 to a Class 4. A Class 4 rating for a city our size is a great accomplishment. We continuously work hard to find ways to improve our Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services to the citizens whom we service. This would not be possible without the tremendous support we receive from our Citizens, City Departments and City Leaders.

The (PPC™) program recognizes the efforts of communities to provide fire protection services for citizens and property owners. A community's investment in fire mitigation is a proven and reliable predictor of future fire losses. Insurance companies use PPC information to help establish fair premiums for fire insurance — generally offering lower premiums in communities with better protection. By offering economic benefits for communities that invest in their firefighting services, the program provides an additional incentive for improving and maintaining public fire protection.

**IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE DRINKING WATER  
Tests Showed Coliform Bacteria in Clinton City's Water**

Our water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this incident was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor for drinking water contaminants. During the month of July, we took 25 routine samples to test for the presence of coliform bacteria. 2 of the 25 samples tested positive for the presence of coliform. The standard is that no more than 1 sample per month may do so.

**What should I do?** You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective actions. However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.

**What does this mean?** This is not an emergency. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. Coliform bacteria are generally not harmful themselves. *Coliforms are bacteria which are naturally present in the environment and are used as an indicator that other, potentially-harmful, bacteria may be present. Coliforms were found in more samples than allowed and this was a warning of potential problems.*

Whenever we detect coliform bacteria in any sample, we do follow-up testing to see if other bacteria of greater concern, such as fecal coliform or *E. coli*, are present. **We did not find any of these bacteria in our subsequent testing, and further testing shows that this problem has been resolved.**

**What happened? What was done?** During July of 2014 our routine samples were taken and had positive coliform test results for two samples. We took six additional follow-up samples at those locations; those six came back with satisfactory results. No further actions were necessary.
