Three (3) City Council Seats (all 4-year terms) are up for election.

Petitions or declarations for candidacy must be correctly completed and filed in person with the City Recorder at 2267 N 1500 W from Monday **June 1st to Monday June 8th, 2015** between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. as set by State Code UCA 10-3-301.

- Your ballot will be mailed 28 days before Election Day.

Sewer/Solid Waste/Water Utility Bill Increases

The City sewer costs are divided up into 2 separate areas: 1) the City cost of maintaining the system which collects the sewage and delivers it to the North Davis Sewer District's (NSDS) system; and, 2) the payment to the (NSDS) for treating our sewage according to state and federal standards at their treatment plant in Syracuse. The NDS must improve their transport and treatment facilities. To accommodate this, beginning in 2014, they began increasing their fees by \$3 per customer per month over a four year period through 2017. There will be a \$3 increase again this year. This is a pass through cost from the NDS.

Additionally, in order to maintain the financial integrity of the Enterprise Funds and prepare for necessary improvements, the City needs to increase the monthly garbage fee by \$1 per can and the water fee by \$1 per household. Thus, your July billing (which comes out in August) will reflect a \$5 increase which includes the \$3 pass through increase from the NDS.
