### 2015 Municipal Elections - No Primary

Four candidates signed up for the three open City Council seats for the 2015 Clinton City Municipal Election. Therefore, there will not be a Primary Election. The General Election will be held on November 3<sup>rd</sup>. Voting will be by mail this year. The four candidates are: TJ Mitchell, Barbara Patterson, Anna Stanton and Tony Thompson. Look for more information on "vote by mail" in the near future.

### Recent Culinary Water Contamination

Due to the detection of contamination of the culinary water system, the City recently had to issue a "boil order" advisory for the culinary water. This was very frustrating for both our citizens and city staff. The citizens of Clinton were outstanding in their patience and understanding during the emergency. City staff worked around the clock to disinfect the water system and discover the contamination source. Once the water was disinfected and source of the contamination located, additional water sampling requirements took days to complete to insure the water was safe. This is why the "boil order" had to stay in effect for four days. Even though complying with a "boil order" would ensure safe drinking water, the City provided nearly 1800 cases of bottled water to our residents. The City's Emergency Notification System, City Website and Facebook page were utilized to post updates on this emergency and provide helpful links and information. We hope this sort of contamination as a result of cross connecting between the culinary and secondary water systems doesn't happen again, please check your valves for a potential cross connection. If you locate one, we ask you to totally disconnect and separate the two water systems. The City will be happy to inspect such a connection to insure the separation viability. Some people have asked about replacement of filters in their home water system. This is not a cost that the City can incur, but you are urged to follow the manufactures recommendations. Thanks to all for your help and patience!

### Sewer/Solid Waste/Water Utility Bill Increases

In order to make necessary improvements to their transport and treatment facilities, beginning in 2014, the North Davis Sewer District initiated increases of their fees by \$3 per customer per month each year over a four year period through 2017. Thus, there will be a \$3 increase again this year. This is a pass through cost from the NDSD.

Additionally, in order to maintain the financial integrity of the Enterprise Funds and prepare for necessary improvements, the City also needs to increase the monthly garbage fee by \$1 per can and the water fee by \$1 per household. Thus, your July billing (which comes out in August) will reflect a \$5 increase which includes the \$3 pass through increase from the NDSD.

### Tour Of Utah

The professional Tour of Utah bicycle race is coming to Clinton. It is comprised of multi-stage race across the State. Stage 3 on August 5<sup>th</sup> will be passing through Clinton! This stage starts at Antelope Island, heads north up through Plain City, then east over North Pass to Eden, around Huntsville and eventually back down to Bountiful for a total of 109 miles. The riders are scheduled to zip along 2000 West to 1800 North at about 10:45am and then head west. Both 2000 W (south of 1800 N) and 1800 N heading west will be temporarily shut down to traffic while the riders and their entourage ride through town. **FIREWORKS SAFETY**

For many in Utah, the use of fireworks has become a tradition. As exciting as fireworks may seem, people often forget that they are playing with explosive materials, dangerous chemicals and combustibles that can destroy property and harm or cause death to unsuspecting victims. These deceptively simple objects explode, throwing unburned powder, hot sparks and embers through the air at high velocities and often create temperatures hotter than 1,200 degrees Fahrenheit.

Please be sure to follow the following firework safety tips:

- Purchase fireworks from reliable, licensed fireworks dealers. Read all instructions to reduce the chances of a destructive fire or debilitating injury.
- Follow all safety guidelines exactly. Children should not handle fireworks. You must be at least 16 years of age to handle or light fireworks. Adults are to supervise any activity that includes fireworks.
- Never let children handle, play with or light fireworks. Only knowledgeable and clear-headed adults should handle fireworks.
- Adults should never use alcohol or drugs or be impaired while engaged in handling, using, placing or lighting fireworks.
- Aerial devices need at least 30 foot clearance on the ground and as much as 150 feet in the air.
- Never shoot fireworks in windy conditions.
- Keep a bucket of water or running hose nearby during lighting and disposing of fireworks and in case of an emergency.
- Use caution with animals. Excitement, noise and lights can cause fear and stress.

Please remember State Law allows the discharge of fireworks 3 days before and 3 days after the 4<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> of July between the hours of 11 a.m. and 11 p.m. except on July 4<sup>th</sup> and July 24<sup>th</sup> the hours are 11 a.m. to Midnight. You can also discharge fireworks on New Year's Eve and Chinese New Year between the hours of 11 a.m. and 1 a.m. Fireworks are an American tradition. Safety and common sense are important as we celebrate the holidays with fireworks. Shooting fireworks can provide hours of wholesome family entertainment, but must be used carefully and safely.
