DEQ Required Water System Enhancements

As reported in last month's newsletter, due to two water related "boil orders" over the last year the City's water system is now under a strict DEQ Enforcement Order. The contamination to our water system causing the two "boil orders" was due to citizens either knowingly or unknowingly violating the culinary water use laws. The requirements of the Enforcement Order are and outcome of these violations and will financially impact the City's Water Fund. As part of the requirements the City has to: dedicate a new employee to cross connection control functions; install and maintain dual check devices at each service connection; purchase and construct a chlorinator system to increase chlorine residual; increase water sampling; increase public education; provide additional system flushing, and many more time consuming reports and studies. Some of these items are functions we had planned on implementing in the future, but now they all must begin immediately. The initial and continuing costs to the Water Fund will be significant. Please make sure you have no cross connections into your culinary water lines. We need everyone's help to preclude another water contamination situation.
