The Nov 3rd General Election is a "vote by mail" election. There are 3 City Council seats up for election with 4 candidates running for them. The candidates are:

- TJ Mitchell;
- Barbara J. Patterson;
- Anna L. Stanton;
- Anthony O. "Tony" Thompson



Also on the ballot are two Propositions: #1- county-wide sales tax increase for transportation (city, county, transit) purposes; and #2 - a School District Bond for current and future school improvements.

Ballots will be delivered to the Post Office on Oct 6th for mailing. You can mail your ballot back anytime up to the Election Day. A ballot "drop off" box will also be available at City Hall up to the day before the election. For anyone not wishing to use the vote by mail or who may have lost their ballot, a traditional election polling place will be available on Nov 3rd at the City Recreation Community Center. There is no cost to you for returning your ballot through the mail. Check our City website for more election information.

Clinton City Fire Department Reminds Clinton City Residents: Hear the Beep Where You Sleep. Every Bedroom Needs a Working Smoke Alarm!

Did you know that roughly half of home fire deaths result from fires reported between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m., when most people are asleep?

Smoke alarms save lives. If there is a fire in your home, smoke spreads fast and you need smoke alarms to give you time to get out. In fact, having a working smoke alarm cuts the chances of dying in a reported fire in half!

Here's what you need to know!

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area and on every level of the home, including the basement.
- Interconnect all smoke alarms throughout the home. This way, when one sounds, they all do.
- Call the fire department from outside the home.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or sooner if they don't respond properly.
- Make sure everyone in the home knows the sound of the smoke alarm and understands what to do when they hear it.
- If the smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside. Go to your outside meeting place.
- Test alarms at least monthly by pushing the test button.
