It is the user's responsibility to ensure that their systems are secure and ready to receive water by April 1, 2013.

Space heaters Safety

During frigid winter temperatures, many families choose to use portable electric space heaters to help heat their homes. While these heaters can be a convenient source of supplemental heat for the home in cold weather, they also increase the risks of fire and electric shock if not used properly. Keep your home warm and your family safe by following these simple space heater safety precautions: Read the manufacturer's instruction manual before using any space heater; Check to make sure the heater bears the mark of a nationally recognized testing laboratory such as Underwriters Laboratories (UL), Canadian Standards Association (CSA) or Intertek (ETL); Keep space heaters at least 3 feet away from any combustible materials, such as bedding, clothing, draperies, furniture, rugs, and holiday decorations; Do not use space heaters in wet or damp areas unless the manufacturer's instructions indicate that it is intended to be used in wet locations such as bathrooms; Do not use space heaters in rooms where children are unsupervised. Children may stick their fingers or other objects through the protective guards, causing burns or shock; Portable heaters have hot parts that can cause sparking. Do not use them in areas where flammable liquids such as gasoline or kerosene are used or stored; Space heaters are meant to supply supplemental heat. Don't use them to warm bedding, cook food, dry clothing or thaw pipes; Plug portable space heaters directly into an outlet; do not use an extension cord; Make certain the circuit into which you plug a space heater can adequately and safely handle the added demand; Unplug and safely store portable space heaters when not in use; Did You Know? Portable and stationary space heaters account for one-third (32%) of home heating fires and four out of five (80%) home heating fire deaths (NFPA). Please be careful out there.

WEST DAVIS CORRIDOR UPDATE

The WDC team is continuing to study and analyze the alternatives in greater detail as it prepares the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) document. Chapters of the Draft EIS document are being written and the team is conducting a comprehensive analysis on various environmental impacts. The results of this in-depth analysis will be presented in the Draft EIS as well as UDOT's preferred alternative. This information is expected to be released in spring 2013 along with a public hearing process and formal comment period. A final Record of Decision is not expected until the study is complete in 2014.
