### WEST DAVIS COORIDOR

The deadline for the official public comment period has been extended to Sept. 6, 2013. During the public comment period, the public is encouraged to review the contents of the Draft EIS and submit their formal comments to the study team for consideration.

The Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is available electronically for review on the Documentation page of the study website: [www.udot.utah.gov/westdavis](http://www.udot.utah.gov/westdavis). A hard copy of the Draft EIS is also available at various city buildings and libraries throughout Davis and Weber counties. The Draft EIS is a large report, documenting all the data, information, input and analysis the team has collected and studied for the past three years of the study. The Draft EIS also identifies UDOT's locally preferred alternative, which a recommendation is based on all the data reported thus far.

All public comments will be reviewed and formally responded to in the Final EIS document, which is expected to be released in winter 2013. This will be followed by a Record of Decision from Federal Highway Administration in spring 2014.

### CITY CODE ENFORCEMENT

A friendly reminder regarding code enforcement; as identified in Title 18, chapter 1 section 7 & 8 of the Clinton City Code; the Clinton City Council has established a process which is intended to afford property owners who are in violation of the City Code the opportunity to deal with their nuisance claims in a timely manner. If the property owner does not correct the offense as required by the ordinance, the offense is remanded to the court system. Once turned over to the courts, the City has no control over the process within the court system.

We urge all residents and or property owners to take more pride in their compliance to City laws, especially with regards to weeds, junk, parking, loud noises, animals, speed limits and traffic signs. The process and cost to the city for code enforcement to help some residents comply is preventable. Thank you.

### National Preparedness Month 2013

This September: You Can Be the Hero.

September is National Preparedness Month (NPM). It is a time to prepare yourself and those in your care for emergencies and disasters. If you've seen the news recently, you know that emergencies can happen unexpectedly in communities just like ours, to people like you and me. We've seen tornado outbreaks, river floods and flash floods, historic earthquakes, tsunamis, and even water main breaks and power outages in U.S. cities affecting millions of people for days at a time.

The Clinton City Fire Department and Police Department may not always be able to reach you quickly in an emergency or disaster. The most important step you can take in helping your local responders is being able to take care of yourself and those in your care; the more people who are prepared, the quicker the community will recover.

This September, please prepare and plan in the event you must go for three days without electricity, water service, and access to a supermarket, or local services for several days. Just follow these four steps:

- **Stay Informed:** Information is available from federal, state, local, tribal, and territorial resources. [www.ready.gov](http://www.ready.gov) or [www.bereadyutah.gov](http://www.bereadyutah.gov) to learn what to do before, during, and after an emergency.
- **Make a Plan:** Discuss, agree on, and document an emergency plan with those in your care. Work together with neighbors, colleagues, Church groups and others to build community resilience.
- **Build a Kit:** Keep enough emergency supplies - water, nonperishable food, first aid, prescriptions, flashlight, and battery-powered radio on hand - for you and those in your care.
- **Get Involved:** There are many ways to get involved especially before a disaster occurs. The whole community can participate in programs and activities to make their families, homes and places of worship safer from risks and threats. Community leaders agree that the formula for ensuring a safer homeland consists of volunteers, a trained and informed public, and increased support of emergency response agencies during disasters. Becoming a Citizens Emergency Response Team (CERT) Member is a great way to get involved

By taking a few simple actions, you can make your family safer.

**Summer is coming to an end. Many residents who have more than one garbage can may be considering turning one back in. If so, please make sure the cans are empty and clean prior to calling to have them picked up. Thank you!!**

Clinton now has 3 roundabouts; one located at 2300 N & 1500 W, another at 2300 N & Cranefield Rd. (3650 W) and the last at 1300 N & 1000 W. More and more roundabouts are being installed not only in Clinton, but throughout the larger community to provide traffic flow and safety. As drivers, we need to become "roundabout smart"! Since roundabouts are actually **ONE-WAY** streets, there are only a few easy things to remember:

- **SLOW DOWN** - most roundabouts have a **15 mph** (or less) speed limit. This gives everyone more time to see and react to vehicular and pedestrian traffic.
- **LOOK LEFT!** - you only have to worry about traffic coming from the **LEFT**. As you approach the roundabout, slow down, look left, pause if you need to, and then merge into the roundabout.
- **BE COURTEOUS** - as in **all** driving situations, use good common sense and courtesy. Everyone knows you enter the roundabout by turning "right", but the other drivers do not know where you plan to exit unless you signal ahead of your turn.

Use of these 3 roundabout driving suggestions will help you have a positive roundabout driving experience.

### Clinton City Projects Update

**1500 West 2300 North to Roy:** This has been a joint City crew and contractor project. The City Crews have completed installation of a new larger water line and a new storm drain pipeline and prepared the construction area so the contractor can move in to accomplish the right-way improvements. The concrete curb will be the next item followed by the new asphalt roadway. Once the contractor is completed the City crews will move back into the project area to install the new sidewalk.

**2450 North CDBG Project Area:** This is an all contractor project and the contractor has moved in and started the infrastructure work on the area. Infrastructure work is underway on the sewer and storm drain systems. There will be curb and sidewalk work in the project area followed by new asphalt roadways. This project will be completed next spring when a seal coat will be applied over the new asphalt.

**Hooper 4300 West:** This is a joint Hooper City and Clinton City project that will extend 3000 West in Clinton from 2415 North to the intersection of 4300 West and 6000 South in Hooper/Roy. This is a federally funded project that was placed on the WFRC Surface Transportation Plan. Clinton City staff will be managing the project and the project is anticipated to take three years to complete. The environmental study will begin once the right-of-way has been secured.

**950 N 1235 W:** This project is replacing the existing sewer line which has very little slope and as a result functions poorly requiring frequent maintenance. The City Sewer Crew is installing the pipeline and will contract for the asphalt restoration work to be done.

Please avoid these construction areas to reduce danger to the workers and unnecessary added impact upon the residents. Thank you.

## **Clinton City to Hold General Plan Open House**

Clinton City, UT: Following over a year of effort by a Citizens' Committee, the new, revised Clinton City General Plan is ready for final input from the people of Clinton City. On Tuesday, September 3, 2013, the Clinton City Planning Commission and Citizens' General Plan Committee will host a General Plan Open House from 5:00 pm- 9:00 pm at the Clinton City Recreation Building. Planning Commission Chair Debbie Barlow commented, "We drafted the new General Plan based on survey results and verbal input from Clinton City Residents. Now that we are done, it is important for all of our citizens to come and ensure that the plan we have is truly the best vision for the future of Clinton City."

Open House guests will have the opportunity to read drafts of the plan, look at maps of future zoning, future parks and trails, and see the overall picture of what Clinton will look like in years to come. Refreshments will also be served. Mayor Mitch Adams said, "The general plan shapes the future of Clinton City; therefore, I encourage the involvement of the citizens in the upcoming General Plan."

Written comment from residents will be taken at the open house, which will be attended by members of both the Clinton City Planning Commission and the Citizens' General Plan Committee. These committee members will be available to present the plan to residents as well as answer any questions that may arise. Following the open house, the Planning Commission will hold a formal Public Hearing on the General Plan. This public hearing will be held Tuesday, September 17, 2013 7:00 pm at Clinton City Hall 2267 N 1500 W. "Clinton City is at a tipping point in deciding its destiny. The General Plan will be vital in retaining what our community values while balancing future growth. The most important component to the plan is input from current residents. I hope everyone in Clinton will take the time to view the plan and give their thoughts on the future of our city." – Karen Peterson, Citizens General Plan Committee Chair.
