As a reminder, winter parking restrictions are in full effect at this time, **no on street parking between the hours of midnight and 7 am or anytime during active snow removal.** If the need arises, you can request special temporary parking permission by calling the police department at 801- 614-0800.

Also, keep your garage door closed and to not leave valuables in your vehicle where they are clearly visible. Please do not start your car and leave it running unattended in the driveway.

Please bring in packages from the front porch as soon as possible to avoid the possibility of theft.

NOTICE OF 2021 BUSINESS LICENSE RENEWAL

Business licenses for the 2021 business year will expire on December 31, 2021. For convenience, renewal applications were mailed in November. If for any reason you did not receive a renewal application, please contact the Clinton City Community Development Department at 801- 614-0740, and we will mail you another one. (Business license fees for renewal businesses, if applicable, shall be due and payable on or before January 1 of each year and shall be delinquent if not paid prior to February 1 of each year.) CHRISTMAS TREE SAFETY

As you deck the halls this holiday season, be fire smart. A small fire that spreads to a Christmas tree can grow large very quickly.

According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA):

If, you use a real tree:

- Choose a tree with fresh needles that don't fall when touched.
- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base.
- Make sure all trees are three feet from any heat source.
- Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit
- Add water daily to the tree stand.

Lighting the Tree:

- Use lights that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory. The lights should have a UL listing or other third party logo on the box. Remember some lights are only for indoor OR outdoor use.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of lights strands that can be connected together.
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.
- Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.

Christmas tree fire facts:

- Almost one third of home Christmas tree fires are caused by electrical problems.
- Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they are more likely to be serious.
- A heat source too close to the tree causes roughly one in every five Christmas tree fires.

CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL

Never put tree branches or needles in a fireplace or wood-burning stove. When the tree becomes dry, discard it promptly. Robinsons Waste Management will start picking up natural Christmas trees on Tuesday, **January 4, 2022**. Trees must be curbside before 6 A.M. but preferably the night before.

Remember if it is predicable it is preventable!

Clinton City Snow Removal Information

Winter

Snow Plow Facts:

- Plow blades cost \$1,100 each and only last 2 1/2 storms
- It takes 10 trucks/drivers about 12 hours to plow the City from a 3 inch storm.
- A 6 inch snow storm adds about 30% more time and money
- Note - cul-de-sacs & residential streets west of 2000 W in Clinton are contracted out for snowplowing.



WARNING!

DO NOT SHOVEL/BLOW SNOW INTO THE STREET

Piles of snow on roads create frozen bumps that contribute to car crashes and are dangerous for our drivers if the snow plow hits one! They also have the potential to create drainage problems, drifting, sight obstruction and hindered accessibility.

Plus, those piles slow the snow plow drivers down in the wake of a storm. DAMAGE TO SNOWPLOWS FROM SNOW BLOWN IN THE STREETS COSTS THE CITY MONEY. FINES MAY BE IMPOSED!

 Approximately 80 lane miles plus trails

1. Major Roads

 5. Trails

Removal Timeline
 Keep at least one travel lane in each direction open in storms that accumulate at least 1"/hr

RESPONSIBILITIES
 1800 N and 2000 W

- PRIORITIES
- Principal Arterial
 - Minor Arterial
 - Urban Collector

HOME OWNER
Residential Sidewalks

Removal Timeline
 Removal required within 24 hours after end of snowfall

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Sidewalks in front of and along the sides of home
- adjacent mailboxes
- adjacent fire hydrants

Blocked Driveways: Snow accumulated on the plow blade has no place to go but in the road right-of-way, which includes driveways. Many times snow plowing forms snow drifts across driveway approaches, which may create hardships for some residents. However, the City possesses neither the personnel nor the equipment to clear thousands of driveway approaches within the City. Snow removal from driveway approaches is the residents' responsibility.

Parking: Current City Ordinance prohibits parking on the street from November 15th through March 15th from midnight to 7:00 a.m. Residents can also help by removing vehicles, trailers and garbage cans from the street anytime snow plows are out working.

Also, please be aware City Code 25-11-6 requires Private Property Owners/Occupants to keep public sidewalks immediately abutting their property clear of snow within 48 hours of a storm. Do not throw, pile, or place snow from the sidewalk, driveways, or park strips into the street or gutter. It is especially important to keep snow cleared from fire hydrants.

KEEP THEM CLEAR

If there's a fire hydrant near your house, do your part to keep it accessible this winter:

3 ft. 3 ft.

CLEAR-AWAY ZONE

Remove any snow and ice
 Clear a wide enough perimeter around the hydrant for firefighters to work (about 3 feet)
 Clear a path from hydrant to street

And, please make sure to remove your garbage cans from the street once the garbage can has been emptied. Ordinance 13-5-9 paragraph (3) states: All empty containers or garbage receptacles must be removed from the street the same day they are emptied. This will help with snow plowing the street after a storm in the winter and for street sweeping spring through fall.

PARKS ADVISORY BOARD:

Disc golf can still be played at Civic Center Park, even in the winter. Also, the Board would like to know if citizens would consider an "Adopt-a-Bench" program in 2022 (placing benches in our parks and along our trails).
