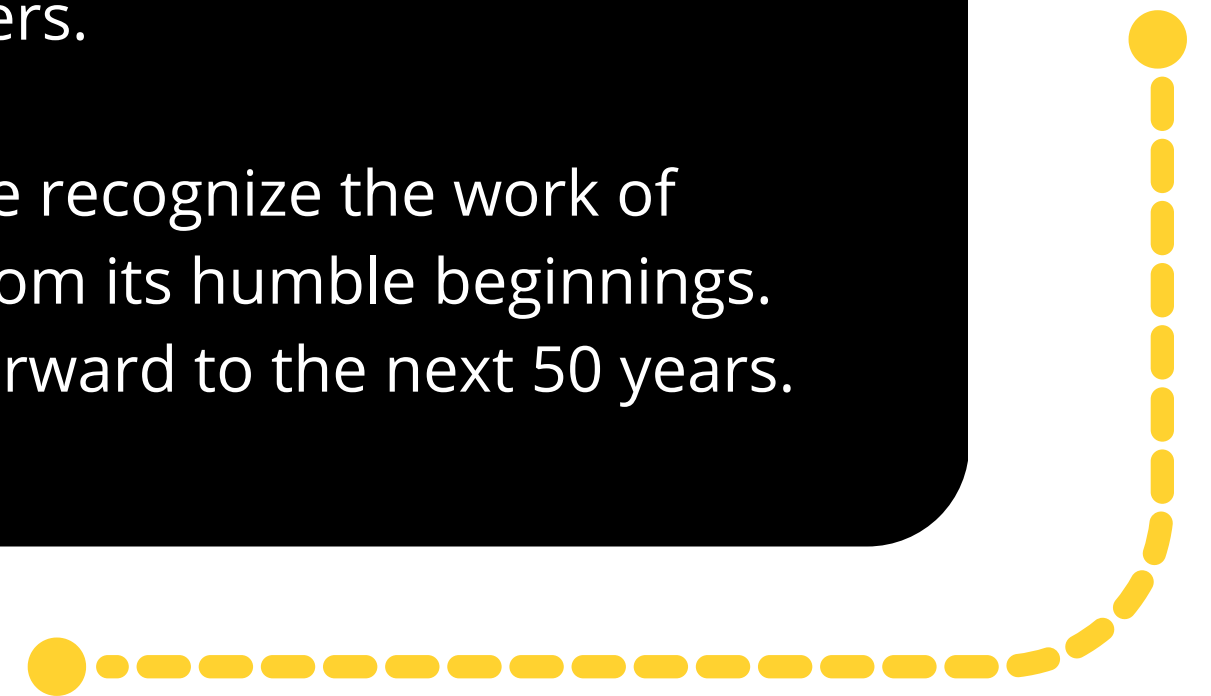


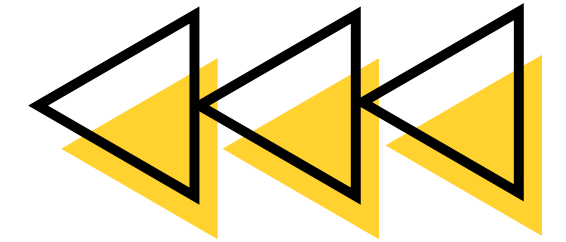
50 YEARS AND COUNTING

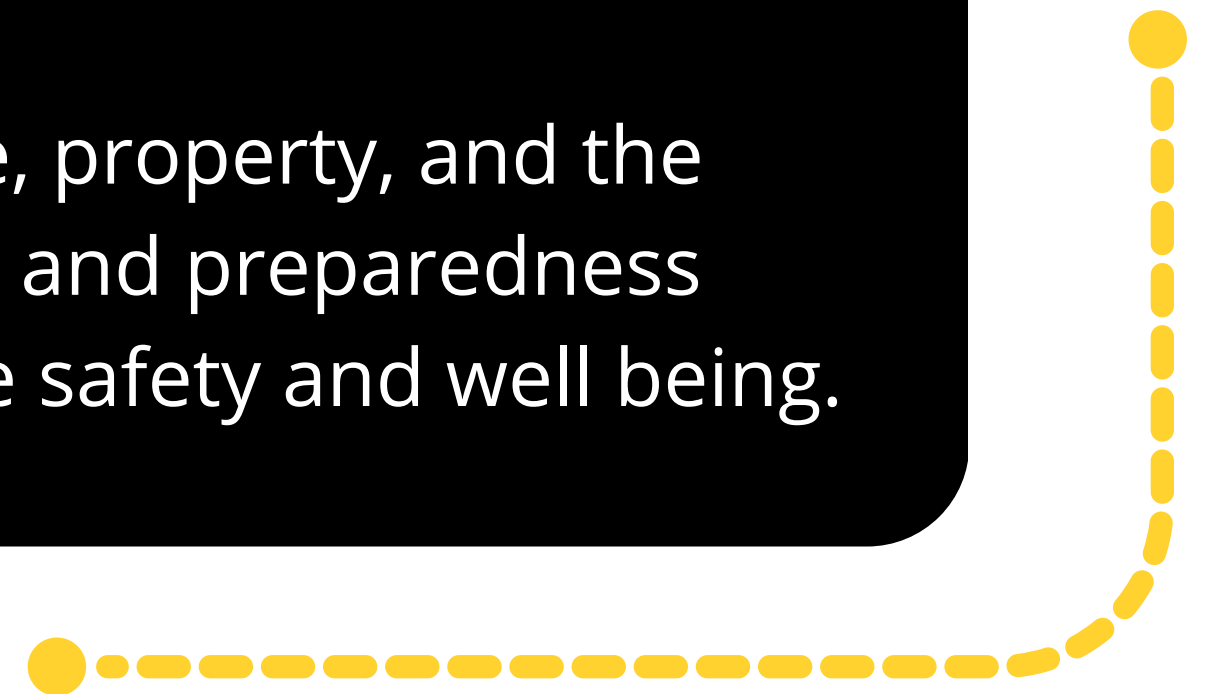


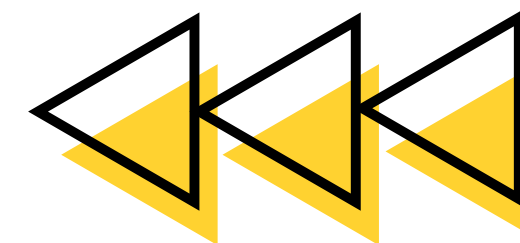
VISION

To mitigate the impact of hazardous situations on life, property, and the environment through effective response, prevention, and preparedness programs, while maintaining a high level of employee safety and well being.

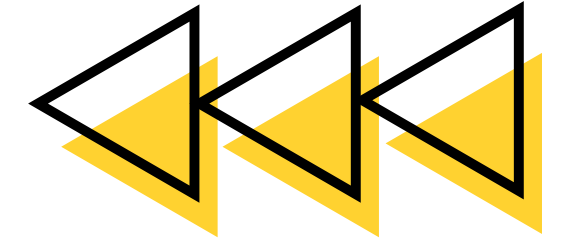

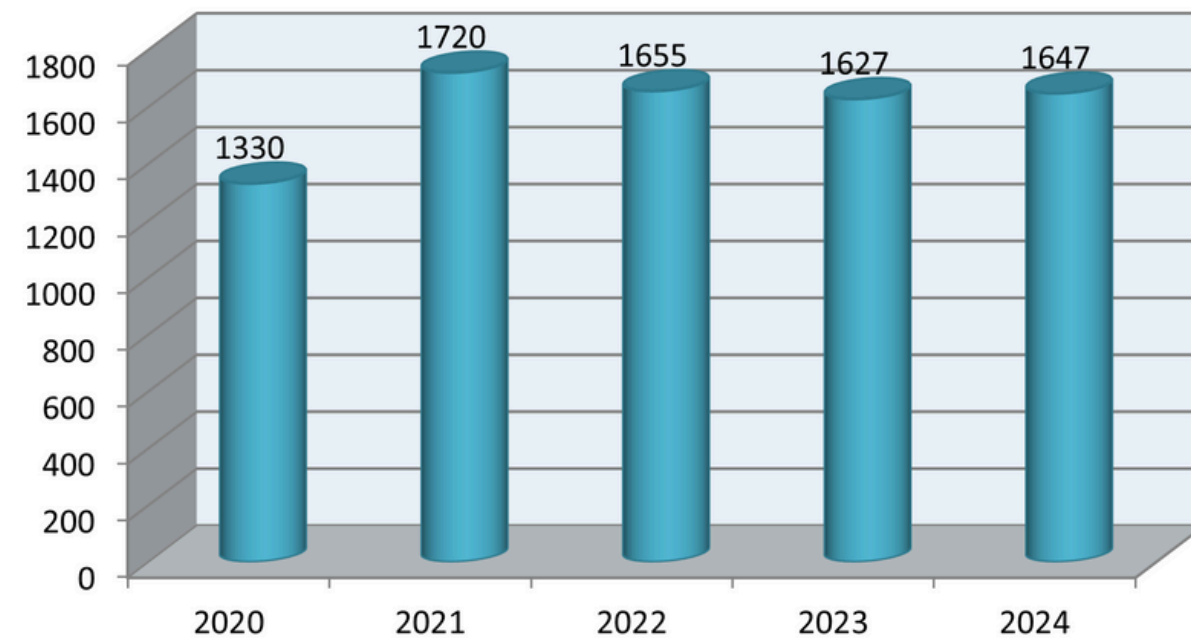

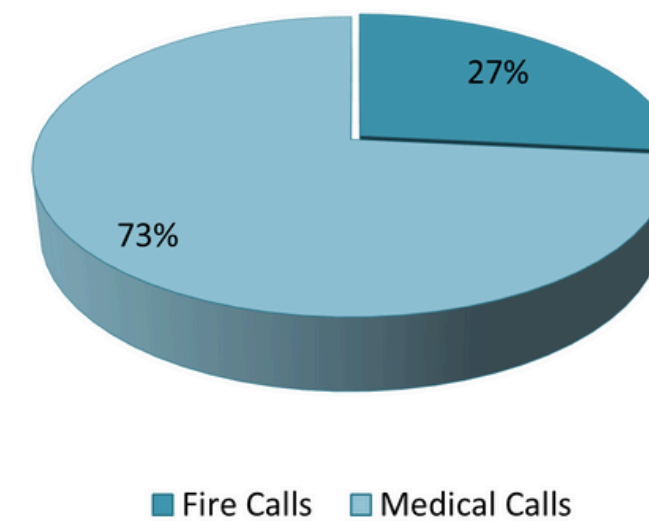


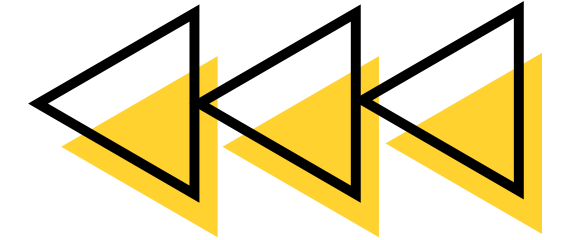
911 CALL DATA

Total Calls 2024



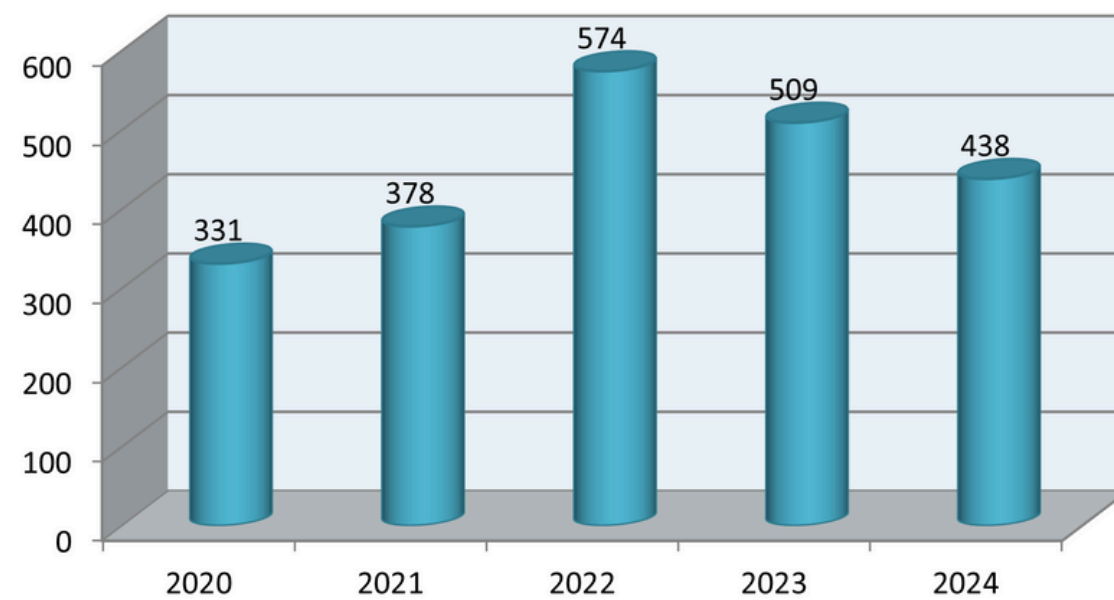
Call Volume Percentage by Category



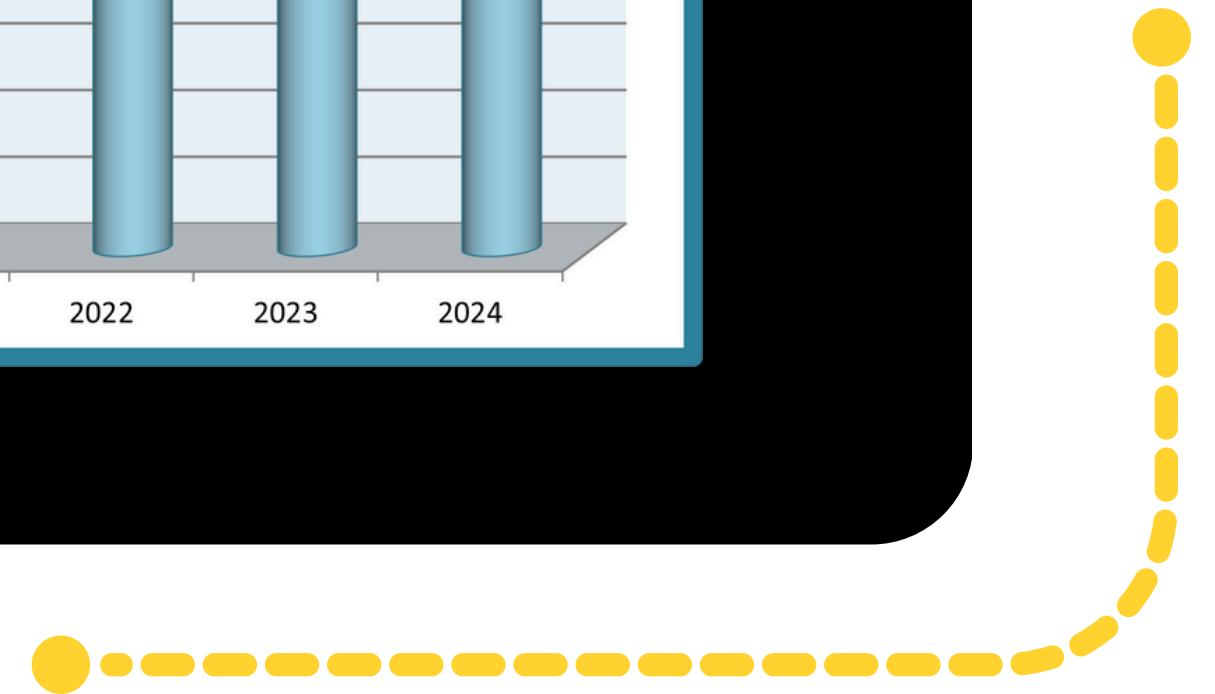
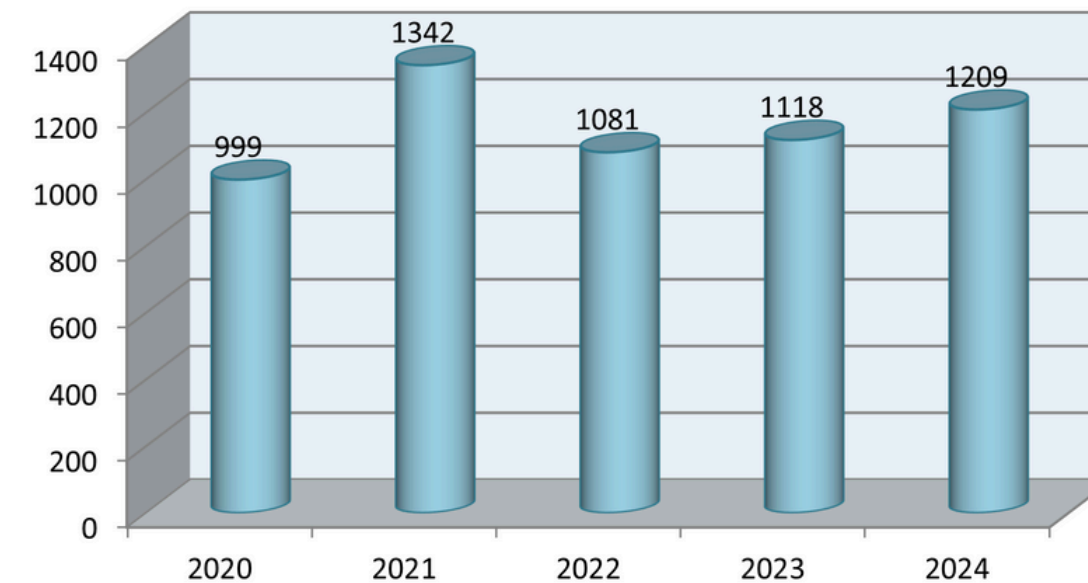

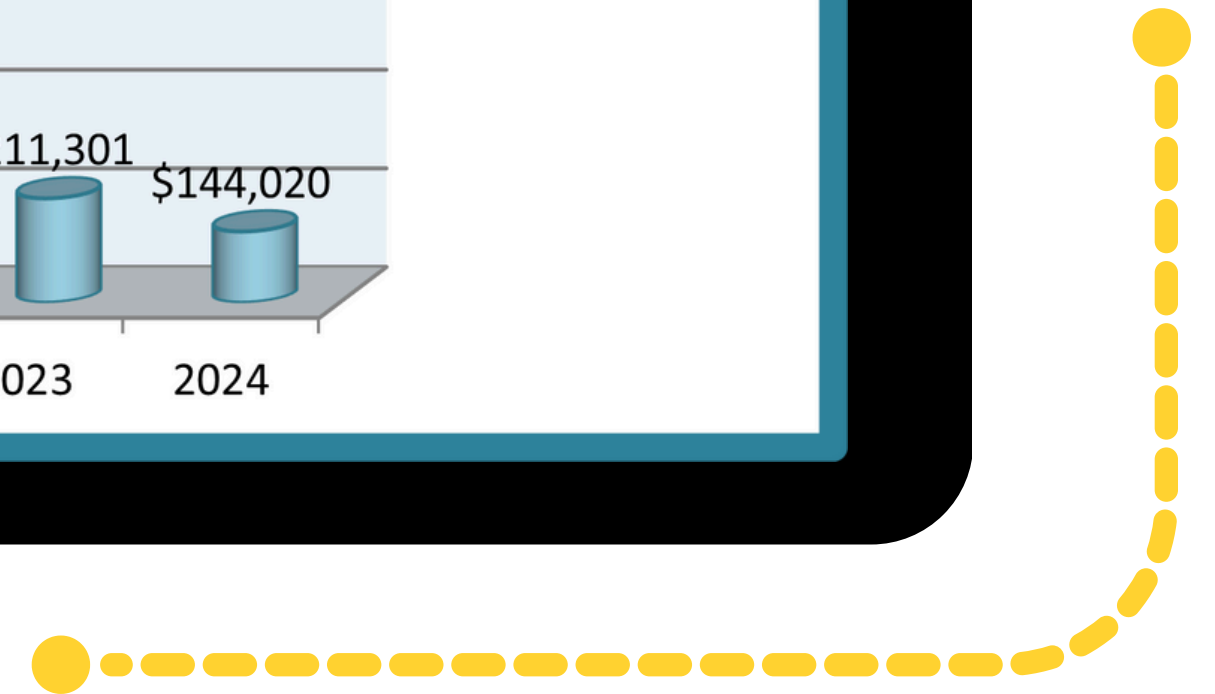
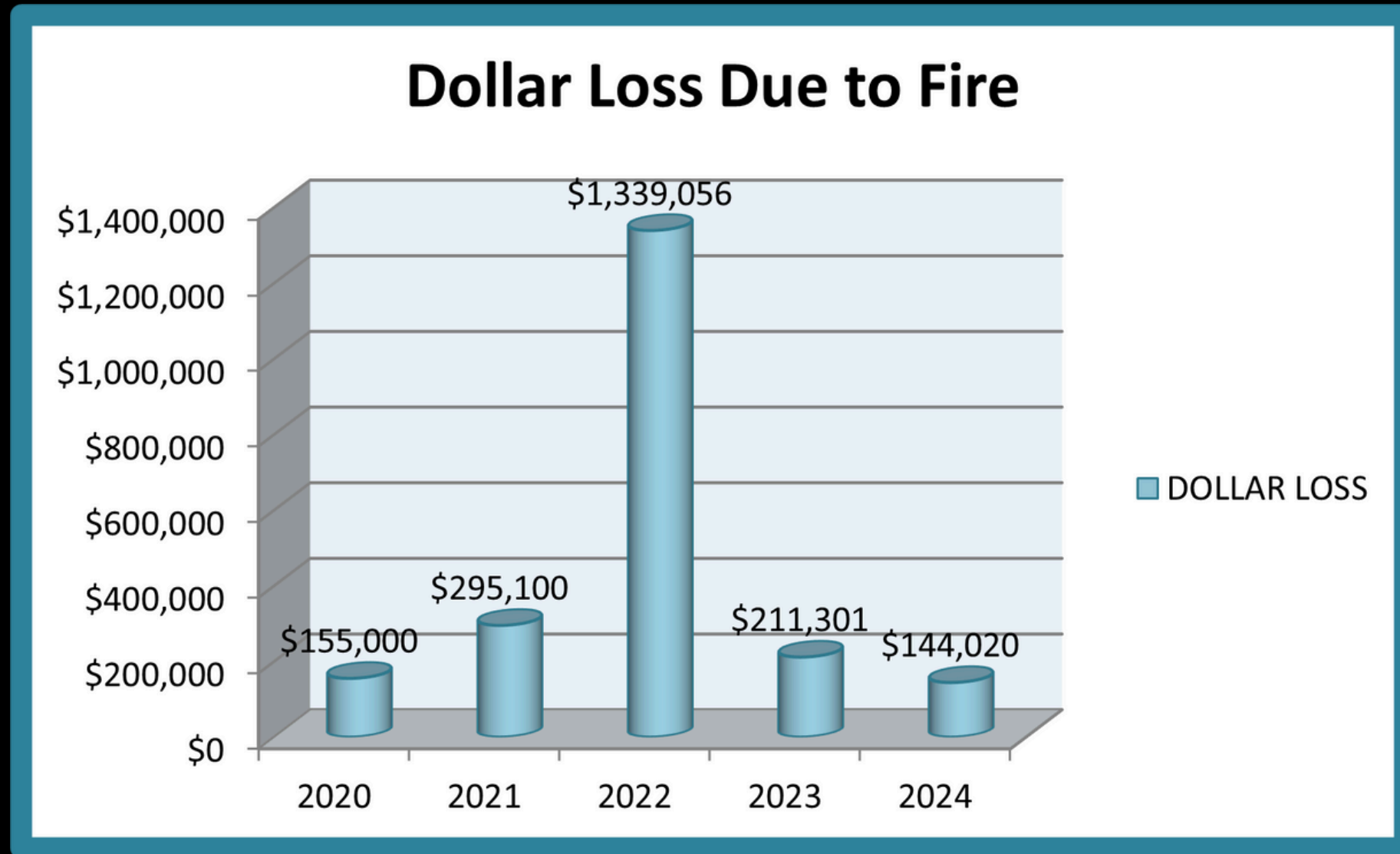
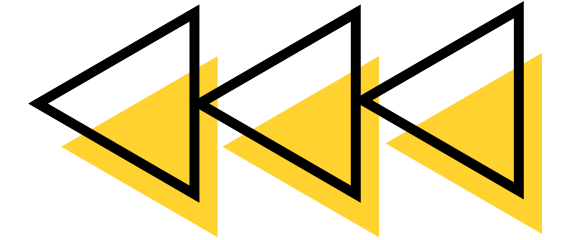
Fire Calls 2024

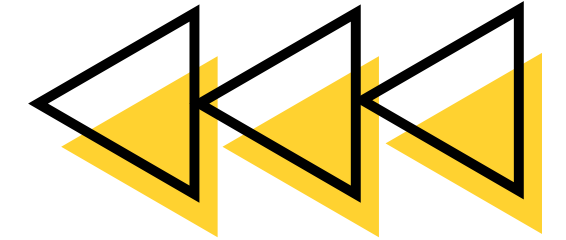


Medical Calls 2024



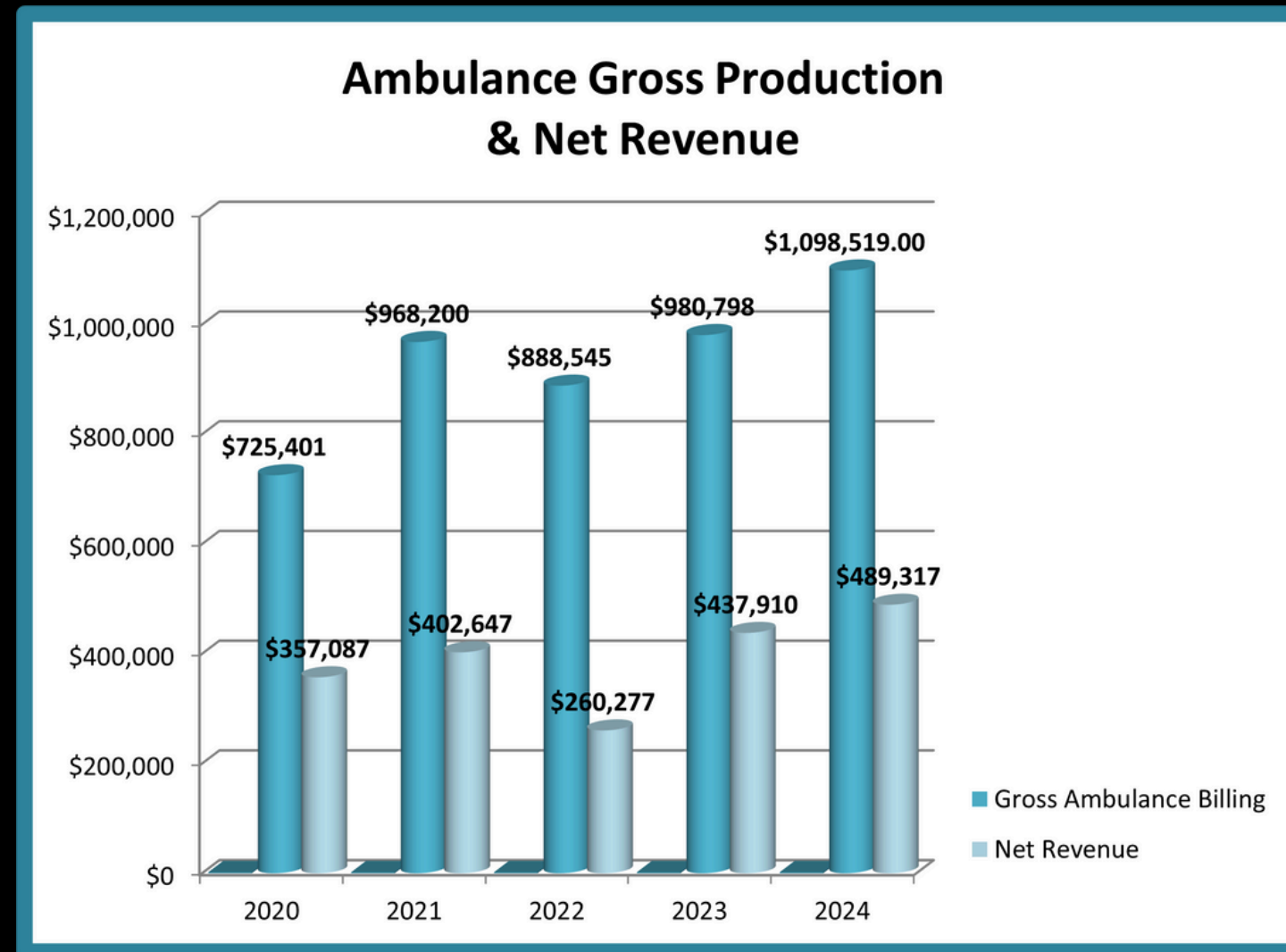

AMBULANCE REVENUE

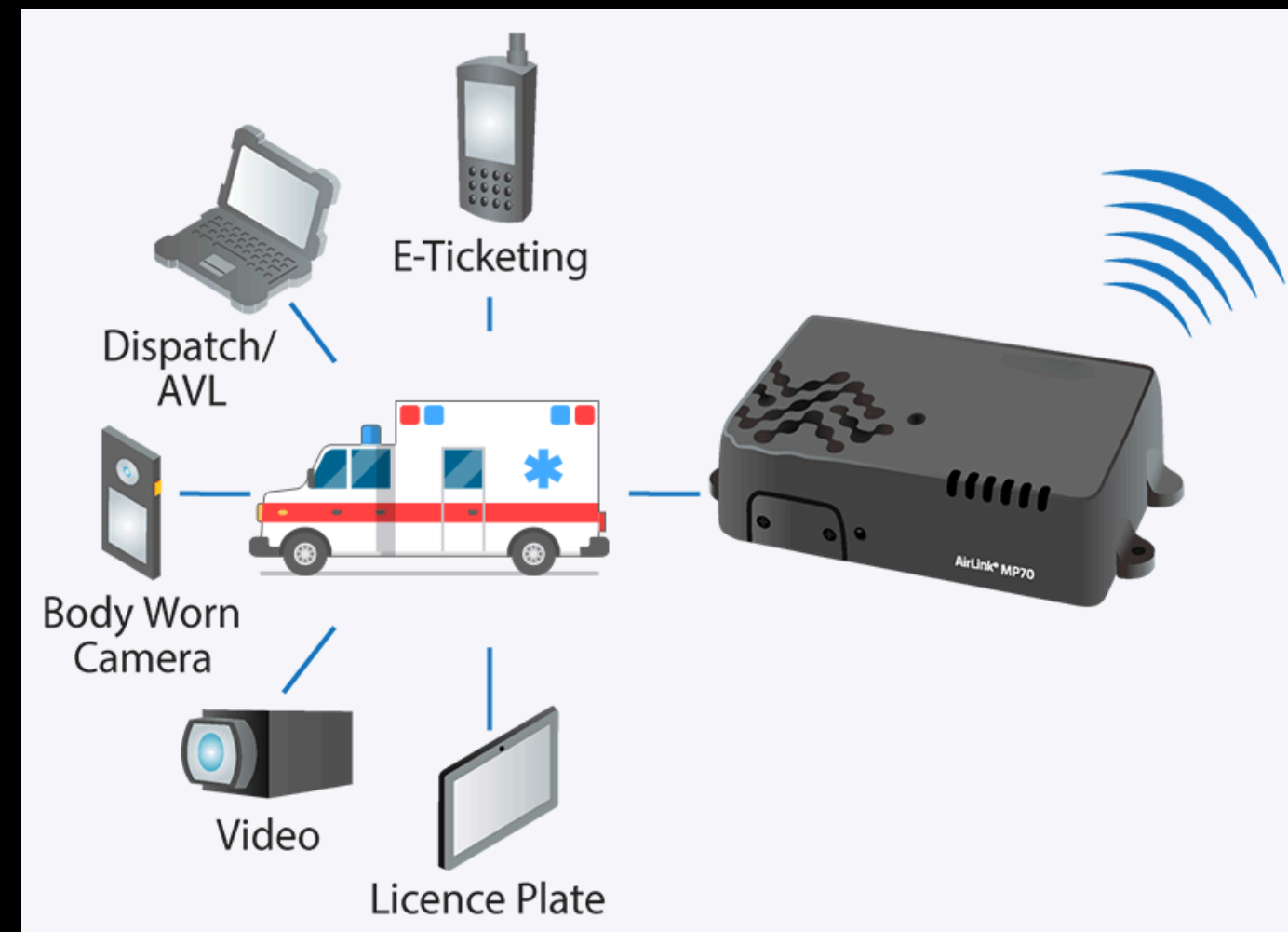

We have worked with Iris Medical for many years, but they closed their doors in January 2025. We have entered a contract with a new billing company beginning January 1, 2025. AVL

The Automatic Vehicle Location system was initiated in January 2024. This system uses GPS tracking to locate paramedic units, enabling emergency dispatchers to send the closest available paramedic unit to medical emergencies. In medical emergencies time counts! This technology gets experienced caregivers to patients faster than ever.

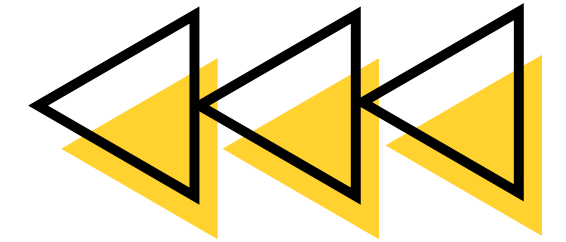


NEW EQUIPMENT

LUCAS III

The Lund University Cardiopulmonary Assist System is a device that performs mechanical chest compressions during CPR. The LUCAS performs constant and effective compressions which reduces strain on care providers and increases survival rates for patients.

Motorola APX 6000

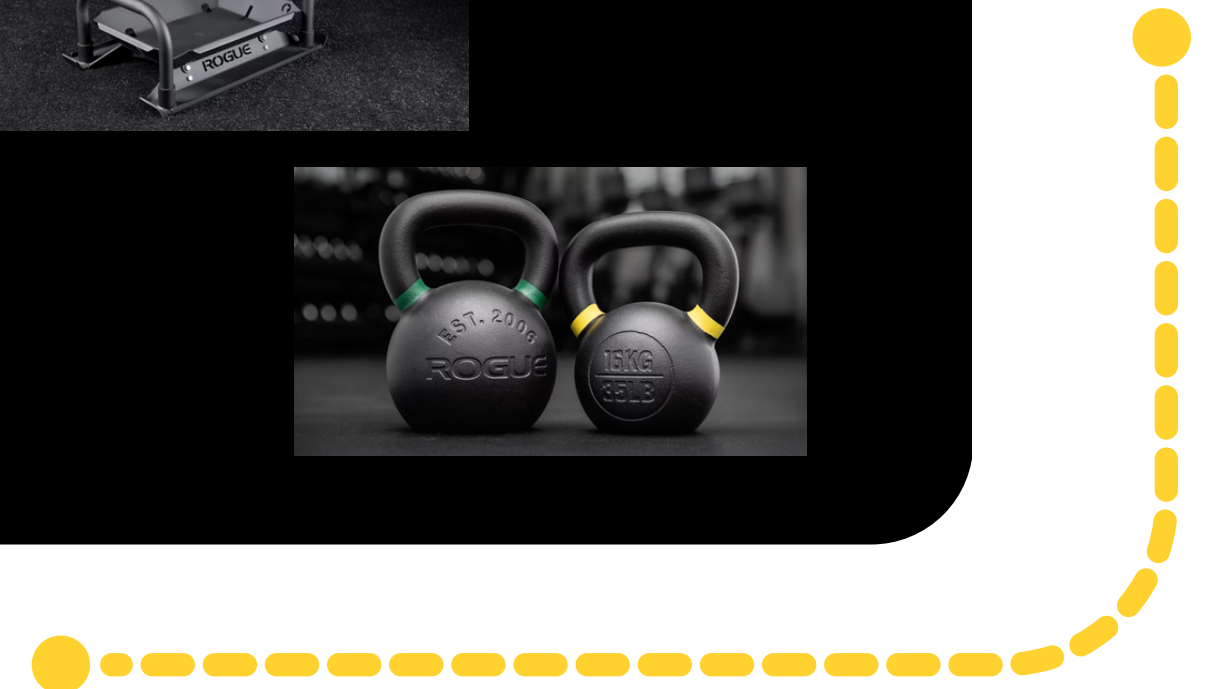
Motorola portable two-way radios used for communication during emergencies.



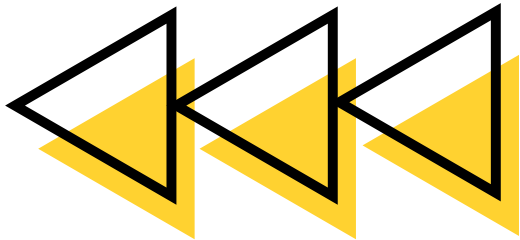
Bailout Bag

A bailout bag is a specialized bag that firefighters carry to provide a way to escape from dangerous situations when their normal escape is blocked by fire or building collapse. It contains necessary equipment like ropes, descent devices, and safety harnesses to help firefighters safely descend from a higher level.
